

#### The following will be in both the May and June edition of the newsletter:

#### Who May Be Elected An Officer Of The Council?

Supreme Council's Charter, Constitution and Laws of the Order

Eligibility For Office SEC. 92. (a) Only members who have been initiated in the first three degrees of the Order shall be eligible for any office in subordinate, State or Supreme Councils, or in the Order. This shall not apply to the first officers of a new subordinate Council, or to medical examiners. State Deputies, etc., may Declare Office Vacant (b) A State, District or Territorial Deputy may declare any office in a subordinate Council vacant, where the officer fails or refuses to perform the duties of his office.

<u>Elections SEC. 93</u>. In all cases of election to any office in the Order or its branches, a majority of all the votes cast shall be necessary to elect; except that where several of equal degree are to be chosen as directors, trustees, delegates, etc., a majority shall not be necessary, but all shall be voted for on one ballot. No ballot containing names of more or less candidates than there are places to be voted for shall be counted, and those receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected in order of the number of votes received and to the number of places to be filled.

#### What title are Past Officers Entitled To Use?

<u>SEC. 94</u>. Supreme Knights, State Deputies and Grand Knights completing at least one full term of any of said offices or having served more than six full months of an unexpired term in any of said offices, shall be entitled to the title and privileges thereof with the prefix "Past" on retirement from the same, provided a member elected Grand Knight of a Council at its institution or elected State Deputy upon the organization of a State Council and holding until the end of such term, shall have the same title and privileges as if he had filled a full term. Also, a member shall have such title but not the privileges in the Council or jurisdiction to which he may subsequently transfer his membership.

Below is a "Slate of Officers" who have been nominated for Fraternal Year 2019-2020. However, during the general meeting, <u>any 3rd Degree member may "throw his hat or name into the ring" and be considered by votes of the members present</u>. The member having the most number of votes will be elected.

**SEC. 145 Trustees**: (In part) Thereafter, at each succeeding election, one Trustee shall be chosen for a term of three years.

#### SPIRITUAL COMMUNION



Pope Francis prays for those who are isolated due to the spread of COVID-19, he invites Catholics to unite ourselves to Christ and one another in the spiritual communion of the Eucharist. "In this situation of pandemic, in which we find ourselves living more or less isolated, we are invited to Holy Communion that unites all the members of the Church."

The Pope said: "United to Christ we are never alone, but we form one single Body, of which he is the Head." The Pope called it "a union that is nourished with prayer and also with the spiritual communion in the Eucharist, a practice that is highly recommended when it is not possible to receive the sacrament."

Spiritual Communion is the practice of desiring union with Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. It is used primarily by individuals who cannot receive Holy Communion, such as the ill, the divorced and remarried, and those who have not yet been received into full communion with the Church. St. Thomas Aguinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the most holy sacrament and lovingly embrace him" at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive him in sacramental Communion.



#### **ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION**

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You. Amen.


#### Room 9 Cleanup

#### REPORT OF STATE CONVENTION (VIRTUAL BY PHONE), SATURDAY, MAY 16, 2020

State Deputy M. Vassallo called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m. sharp and the State Chaplain then led the delegates in Prayer.

Supreme Knight Carl Anderson spoke to the Convention, mentioning that our organization had set up a \$100 million church loan fund, that our membership had now passed 2 million and that in the past year the Knights of Columbus Organization had contributed \$185 million to charity.

Supreme Secretary Michael O'Connor was introduced as a special guest and he in turned thanked Arizona Knights for sending Sean Halpain to the Supreme Board of Directors. He commended AZ KofC for contributing \$1.7 million last year to charity. Sean Halpain spoke of needing to sign more members.

The State Insurance Agency spoke of a statewide insurance event set for June 13.

The State Chaplain reminded all that Pentecost is coming soon.

The State Secretary reported that 161 delegates were on line as well as 7 state officers.

The Minutes of the last meeting were approved; the Report of Committees was accepted and the Officers Report was accepted as emailed.

Election of Officers – Past State Deputy Sean Halpain presided over the election of officers for 1 year terms as follows:

Delegates to the Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council were elected as follows: the 5 State Officers listed above, as well as Chaplain Regula, Past State Deputy Sayers, White and Neilsen. There were 10 Alternates who were elected as follows: Mike Kingman, Peter Carculious, Ken Gallagher, James Leonards, Pedro Nachara, Chet Yancey, George Fisher, Rudy Cavalina, Ollie Severt and Louie Cooper..

Resolutions - #1 thru #15 adopted unanimously.

New Business – Budget as presented was adopted.

State Convention Host for 2022 – Hilton Conquistador, Tucson, approved, with host Council being #14230 St. Rita of the Desert.

Sean Halpain presided over the annual meeting of the AZ KofC Charity, Inc., which elected 2 new board members: Ken Gallagher and Jim Agnew.

Chaplain closed the meeting with a prayer invoking the intercession of Father McGivney. Adjourned at 4:40 p.m.



Dear Brother Knights,

It is with particular joy that I write to share with you the news that, at Noon today in Rome, on May 27, 2020, the Vatican announced the formal recognition of a miracle attributed to our founder, Venerable Father Michael McGivney.

With this announcement, a Mass of Beatification will soon be scheduled.

This joyful news is the culmination of many years of determined effort, and I ask for your continued and increased prayers as we prepare for the day when our founder will be known as "Blessed Michael McGivney."

The Vatican announcement can be found below:

#### Decrees of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints

On May 26, 2020, the Holy Father Francis received in audience His Eminence Cardinal Angelo Becciu, prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. During the audience, the Supreme Pontiff authorized the same Congregation to promulgate the Decrees regarding:

[...] the miracle, attributed to the intercession of the Venerable Servant of God Michael McGivney, Diocesan Priest, Founder of the Order of the Knights of Columbus; born on August 12, 1852 in Waterbury (United States of America) and died in Thomaston (United States of America) on August 14, 1890; Venerable Michael McGivney was the founder of the Knights of Columbus, now the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization. After studies in Canada and the United States, he was ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop James Gibbons in Baltimore. He founded the Knights of Columbus as a mutual aid society, geared especially to working men and their families. He was known for his tireless work among his parishioners. He died at the early age of 38 from pneumonia.


I would ask each brother Knight to learn more about our founder at the newly updated Father McGivney Guild website where the Order will also regularly post news and updates related to the beatification.

#### **Pentecost**

Pentecost is a **special day of worship**. The feast marks the end of the Easter season for Christians and commemorates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the early followers of Jesus. The Church of God, which began on Pentecost which we read about in Acts 2 is given the mission of preaching the Good News of the Kingdom of God.

The Christian holiday of **Pentecost**, which is celebrated the 49th day (the seventh Sunday) after Easter Sunday, <sup>[2]</sup> commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1–31).



The holiday is also called "White Sunday" or "Whitsunday" or "Whitsun", especially in the United Kingdom, where traditionally the next day, Whit Monday, was also a public holiday (since 1971 fixed by statute on the last Monday in May). In German, Pentecost is called *Pfingsten*, developed through contracting the Greek term pen[te]k[os]te, and often coincides with scholastic holidays and the beginning of many outdoor and springtime activities, such as festivals and organized outdoor activities by youth organizations. The Monday after Pentecost is a legal holiday in many European countries.

In Eastern Christianity, Pentecost can also refer to the entire fifty days of Easter through Pentecost inclusive; hence the book containing the liturgical texts is called the "*Pentecostarion*". Since its date depends on the date of Easter, Pentecost is a "moveable feast".

Pentecost is one of the Great Feasts of the Eastern Orthodox Church, a Solemnity in the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, a Festival in the Lutheran Churches, and a Principal Feast in the Anglican Communion.

Many Christian denominations provide a special liturgy for this holy celebration.

#### Arizona Knights of Columbus Have It Made In The Shade



With the year-round sunshine we enjoy in Arizona, we spend a lot of time outside. Having a shade canopy is a must.

Two Arizona Councils can win a custom 10' x 10' Knights of Columbus canopy. Each canopy has "KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS" printed on two opposite sides in English and the other two sides in Spanish. Each come with a deluxe rolling storage bag and is valued at \$450.

For every two new members brought into Arizona, your council will be entered into a drawing for one of these canopies. They will benefit your programs, activities and recruiting for years to come.

If you bring in two new members, you have one chance to win. If you bring in four new members you will have two chances to win and so on. There is no limit as to how many chances you can earn.

Remember, two canopies will be awarded.

A council can only win one canopy; the drawing will be at the Organizational Meeting in July.

#### **ONLINE EXEMPLIFICATION PROCEDURES**

- Councils should forward this downloadable PDF invitation to all eligible prospects for admission and advancement
- Instruct the candidates to register for the exemplification of their choice by clicking on its associated link within the PDF invitation and filling out the online form. Note that they will need your council number to complete the registration.
- Contact the candidates to guide them through the registration if needed.
- Candidates then participate in the scheduled ceremony.
- After the ceremony, councils must process the candidates by submitting form 100s the traditional way or electronically in Officers Online.

Note: that candidates for admission must be approved by your Council. See the temporary rules for electronic voting
