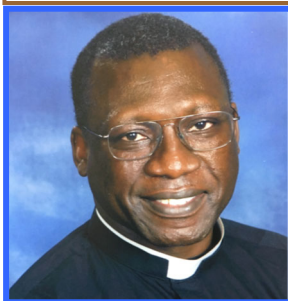

GIVE THEM FOOD YOURSELVES

During my high school boarding days, one of my classmates, Rufus, was fond of going to the kitchen to scavenge for crumbs in the pantry. One fateful day, he ate more beans than his belly could take. Therefore, he had a terrible and painful night, instead of satisfying his hunger. His groaning attracted his closest neighbors, who rubbed oil on his belly so as to ease the horrible pain he was going through. The experience Rufus had left others wondering, why should pain and discomfort be a part of everyday life? Note that gluttony is a deadly sin. Jesus Christ stresses the fact that one does not live by bread alone, but by the word that proceeds from the mouth of God (Matthew 4:4). Jesus Christ fed his audience with spiritual food for their eternal journey, before miraculously serving them bread and fish to energize them back to their destinations.

Jesus Christ withdrew, to mourn the death of his cousin, John the Baptist, but the crowd needed him desperately to enable them to reconnect and be empowered by the Word of God. Jesus accepted his relevance to the needy, as should a physician in the time of a pandemic. Saving lives should be the goal; right away, by listening and responding positively. Jesus Christ knew it was not about him, but about those that craved his attention. Having been in the midst of the crowd for awhile, Jesus' disciples wanted him to send the people away, because it was getting late and there was not enough food to feed the over 5,000 people.

The United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization estimates that about 815 million people out

of the 7.6 billion people in the world or one out of ten in the world, are suffering from chronic under-nourishment as of 2016. However, most of the hungry people are in the developing countries across the world. This maybe due to conflicts, war, draught, and corrupt government leaders who divert federal resources for their selfish gains (Retrieved 07/21/2020). Today, if one views local or global TV news, listens to radio channels, reads internet journalism, or travels to some parts of the world, the reality of malnourished children and adults is so disturbing. The devastating situation calls for action such as that of Jesus Christ. We have to stretch our resources for others; the greatest set of people are not revered for their riches, knowledge, influence nor dominance, but for using everything at their disposal to uplift human dignity.

The miracle of the multiplication of loaves and fishes, like the Passover Feast, foreshadows the Eucharistic sacrifice; Jesus Christ is not using signs and symbols, but his actual body and blood to nourish and empower our troubled souls. This is pertinent, as in every culture, religion, and human setting, food is central and pivotal in curing, protecting and preventing disease in the body; it furthermore marks covenants, ceremonies, jublations, and seasons. For over two thousand years, the Blessed Eucharist has become the life of the church; unique and spectacular in reaching out to the faithful across the world irrespective of races, cultural differences, languages, classes, and values. . . however, the substances remain the same.

I have been elected to the Catholic Daughters of the Americas Board of Directors as a National Director. This position is for a term of two years (August 2020 – July 2022). I will serve with 9 other directors with assignments overseeing three or four

state boards. I also will be attending meetings in various locations and also the headquarters in New York City.

Catholic Daughters of the Americas was formed in 1903 in Utica, New York to give the wives of the Knights of Columbus members spiritual and social opportunities .

I joined Catholic Daughters in Arizona in January 2005, Court Our Lady of Guadalupe #2250, in Phoenix. Our meetings were at Sts. Simon and Jude and now we meet at Host Holy Trinity. I have served as an officer in many positions since joining the court. My court has done fundraisers here at St. Paul's.

I was asked by Susan Mone', State Regent, in Oct. 2010 to join

the state board and I said yes. Little did I know at that time I would be asked to consider being on the National Board. 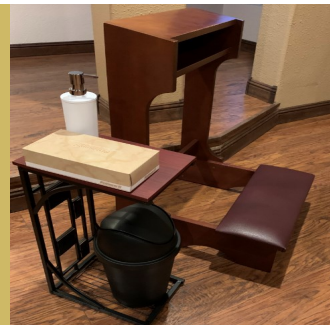
Benefits:

- Practice new COVID precautions procedures in advance of full transition to Perpetual Adoration Ministry
- Ability to learn the new procedures found in Adoration Handbook for “how to” sign-in board process to maintain **maximum of 4 people**. Handbook available by chapel.
- Improve safety: each kneeler has hand sanitizer, cleaning wipes which allows person to sanitize and confirm area is clean. Upgraded A/C filters to enhance clean air exchange
- Provide a more intimate space for private prayer & experience Adoration Chapel ambience. Provide an opportunity for new people to engage in Eucharistic Adoration without committing to specific schedule.
- To provide a transition to 24/7 Perpetual Adoration Ministry who will continue safety precautions. With this opening, the tabernacle door is locked for security to our Lord present in tabernacle, so it is ok for the chapel to be unattended.
- Opened when parish maintenance is on campus for personal security.

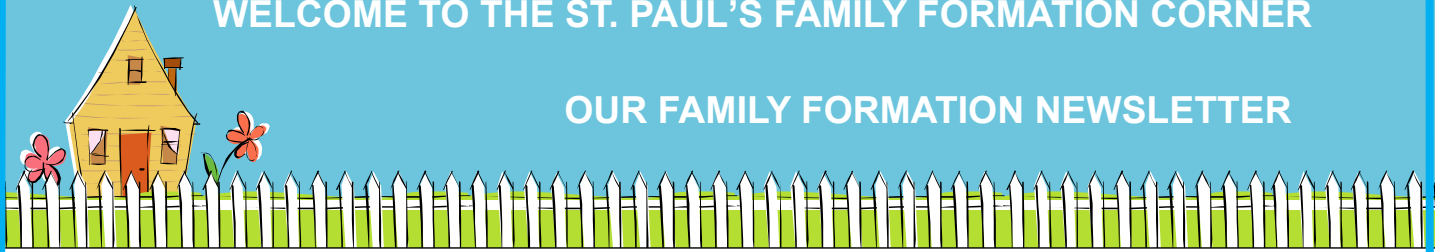

Hope Remains: A Journey to Africa By Dr. Sue Moravec

(Part 7) The last week in Nigeria was centered on daily events leading to the February 20th, 2020 Ordination of friend Bishop-Elect Julius Kundi. The Diocese of Zaria and the Diocese of Kafanchan were once 1 big Diocese. They split into two and Bishop George Dodo became the 1st Bishop of Zaria in March, 2001. The Vatican announcement that a priest from the Diocese of Zaria would be named 2nd Bishop in the Diocese of Kafanchan brought overwhelming joy to people in both Dioceses. Zaria is about 90 minutes north of Kaduna (closer to the militants). Those of you who have been at St. Paul for several years remember Bishop George's annual visits. During those visits, my "African airport shuttle" would pick up Bishop George from the airport. During his visits, we would share life updates. One time I was so over worked & exhausted. He asked me why and I could just offer up that it is the American way to work hard, earn money and hope it is enough for retirement. He just smiled at me and said, "Retirement doesn't exist for the people of Nigeria. Sue, you never have to worry about retirement, you come to my Diocese, and be assured that my people will take care of you, because that is what Catholics do, we take care of one another." Just like that, the Bishop had me realigning my life priorities. You can imagine how dynamic our encounter was when I arrived. We just smiled, both of us in such awe of God's goodness that I somehow was in Zaria, Nigeria. In short, **Bishop George Dodo is my hero.** Six days after we left Nigeria, Bishop George and other Bishops led an enormous crowd of Catholics in a non-violent and powerful march through Abuja to protest the killing of innocent Christians by the Islamic militants. <https://guardian.ng/news/catholics-defy-abuja-downpour-protest-against-pervasive-insecurity/> As Catholics, let us take care of each other and pray for our Catholic brothers and sisters in areas of Christian persecution.



It was time for Sue to transform into a Nigerian dress and I wish I could have captured everyone's surprise. All of the priests from Zaria gathered at Pastoral Center for Mass to "send-off" Bishop-Elect Julius Kundi to Kafanchan. After Mass, everyone was invited to a celebratory dinner where I met so many. Yes there was music, food, and Fr. Victor dancing with the children singers/dancers. I was caught by complete surprise when Father Samuel asked for me to go on stage for a presentation from Bishop George. I was so emotional, as the Bishop gifted me presents and welcomed me. Everyone stood applauding. Surprise #2 – I was asked to give a speech. As I stood in front of this crowd, my heart just poured out with loving gratitude as I talked about St. Paul and our love for our missionary Nigerian priests, Fr Victor, Fr. Ishaya, Fr. Bitrus, Fr. Julius, Fr. Lawrence and Fr. Barry (the last two priests had returned back to Zaria, but had served in the Phoenix Diocese). I shared that the St. Paul community was especially favored by our Lord for providing us with missionary priests and always a 2nd home for Bishop George. Don't ask me my exact words, I just know that the Holy Spirit took over and priests were wiping their tears. It is a night I'll never forget!



The next morning a LONG caravan of packed cars, trucks and anything with wheels set off for a long drive to Kafanchan. At the end of the caravan, was Bishop George & Bishop Elect Julius with a live goat, chickens and produce in the back of the car as gifts to the Diocese of Kafanchan. Yep, it is Africa! On the side of the road, villagers and school children in front of their schools, stood waving to the caravan carrying the Bishop-Elect. How many hours did they stand outside? There are no words to describe the deep love the people have for the Catholic Church. We arrived at the Kafanchan Cathedral where hundreds were waiting to greet the new Bishop-Elect. There was singing and cheering throughout. To symbolize a new beginning, they removed the cloth from the former Bishop's chair which had been covered for 2 years. You don't have to speak the local language to join in on glorifying and praising our God.

That evening after such an eventful day, three friends reflected. We were already emotionally drained, so we had nothing but questions to ponder & discuss the wonder of God's plans. It was miraculous that Fr. Victor & I were in Kafanchan. We realized that just a few months earlier we had been just friends hanging out in Kingman, AZ.
