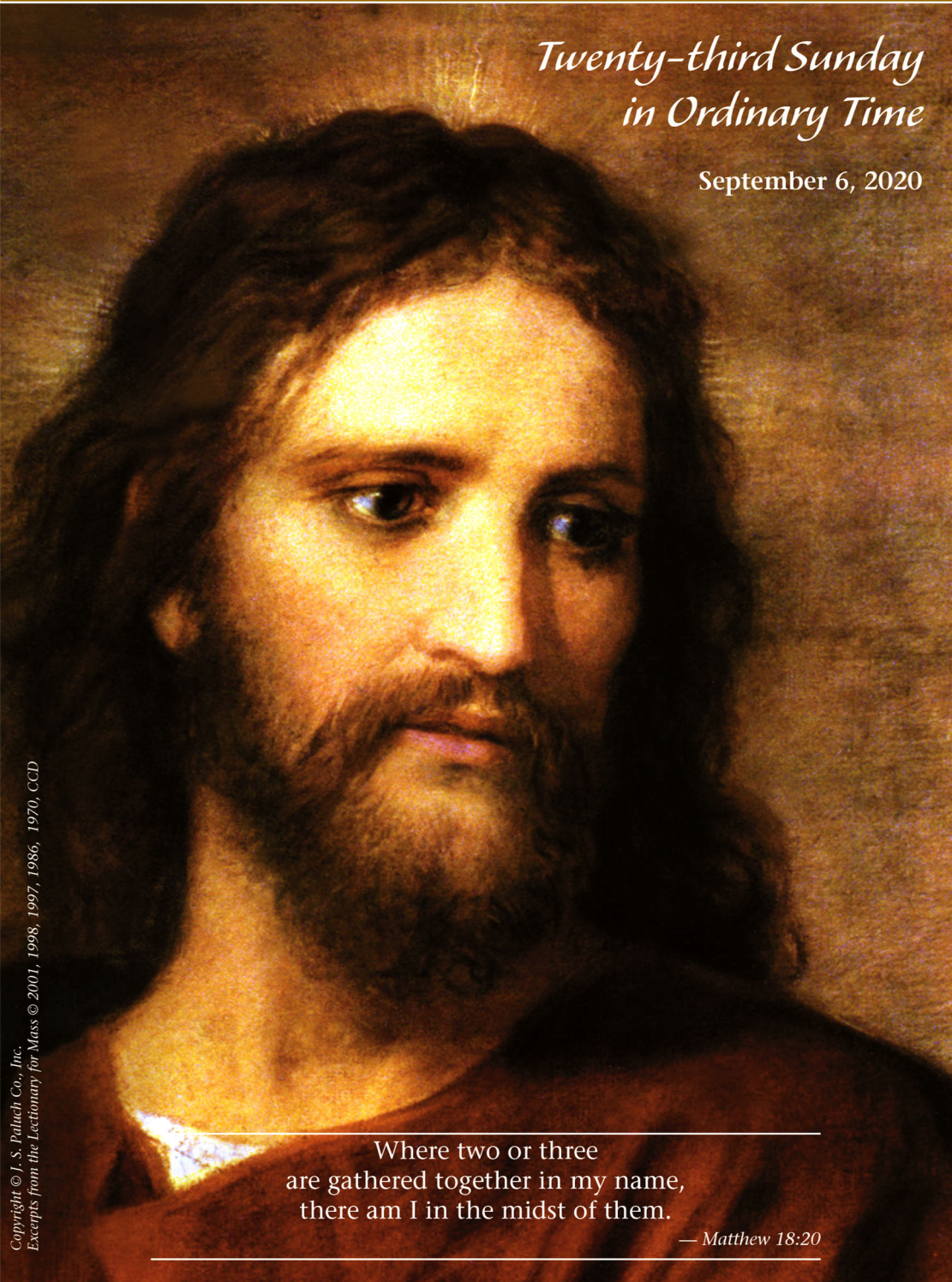

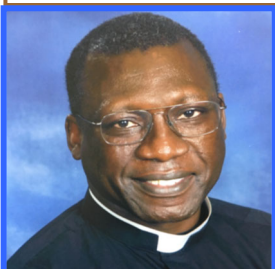

## Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

### September 6, 2020

### *THE POWER OF FORGIVENESS*

The 1994 Rwandan genocide left the citizens of the country with many lessons. Rwanda is a country located in East Africa, with a population of 12.3 million as of 2018. A survey after the war reported that about 800,000 died during the war. The government that succeeded was led by Paul Kagame, who wanted the citizens to reconcile their differences. Therefore, reconciliatory commissions were set up across the country. These commissions aimed at bringing the perpetrators of killings and their victims together, for healing going into the future. Ann-Marie Uwimana, was one of the traumatized, having lost her husband and four children during the genocide. A man named Celestin, one of the perpetrators of the dastardly act that took her family, found his way back to the same community with Ann-Marie. Although her world was shattered, the Parish Priest spoke to Anne Marie about the need to forgive her offenders, in order to heal completely. "The inability to forgive is like cancer, it eats you from the inside," noted a mother whose sixteen-year-old son was shot by a trigger-crazy gunman. Ann-Marie did forgive Celestin and started a friendship with him of sharing meals, faith and other challenges. The dynamics of forgiveness are transformative which leads to eternal peace.

The God in the Old Testament is a forgiving Creator, and a Father: His encounter with Adam and Eve leaves us with a Father who tolerated their disobedience. And He further opened new opportunities for humanity, in order not to be condemned by *original sin*. This is the reason why God sends priests, kings, and prophets to reconcile the gap between Him and

His chosen ones. "Look, I am going to send my messenger to prepare a way before me. And the lord you are seeking will suddenly enter his Temple; and the angel of the covenant whom you are longing for, yes, he is coming, says Yahweh Sabaoth" (Malachi 3:1-2).

In the New Testament, Jesus Christ fulfills the law and the prophets as the Old Testament foretold. It is about the love of God and His unmerited mercy upon humanity in this troubled world. Therefore, Jesus Christ is the bridge to our Father, Creator. His cross is



a symbol of triumph and glory. To benefit from his suffering and sacrifice we have to come to him as the way, the truth and the life. Jesus Christ in his messages to St. Faustina Kowalska says, 'When you go to confession, to this fountain of my mercy, the Blood and Water which came forth from my Heart always flows down upon your soul and ennobles it. Every time you

go to confession, immerse yourself in my mercy, with great trust, so that I may pour the bounty of my grace upon your soul. When you approach the confessional, know this, that I myself am waiting there for you. I am only hidden by the priest, but I myself act in your soul. Here the misery of the soul meets the God of mercy. Tell souls that from this fount of mercy souls draw graces solely with the vessel of trust. If their trust is great, there is no limit to my generosity. The torrents of grace inundate humble souls. The proud remain always in poverty and misery, because my grace turns away from them toward the humble souls (Divine Mercy in My Soul; Retrieved 08/20/2020).

## Hope Remains: A Journey to Africa By Dr. Sue Moravec

(Final Chapter) Friday, February 21<sup>st</sup> and it is our last day in Kafanchan. The morning begins with usual 7am daily Mass in Bishop chapel. This time, Mass is said by a new Bishop and the dynamics change. During the Eucharistic prayer when the priest says we pray for 'our Bishop' now at every single Mass in the Diocese of Kafanchan, the prayer will be read for 'Julius our Bishop.' As the new Bishop reflected, the most humbling part of being Bishop was the thought that his name would be mentioned at every Mass. Unbelievable. After Mass, the new Bishop would have his first meeting of all his priests at the Diocese Pastoral Center in the compound. Fr. Victor and I decided to take a walk in the compound and while walking priests were arriving for their meeting. In one car after another, priests were waving to us and thanking us for coming to Kafanchan. Fr. Victor and I had a great reflective walk as we continued our "high" from yesterday's events. Tomorrow we would fly out from Abuja to return home. We were anxious since COVID had hit New York and Europe had already starting to close airports.



I will be unable to type the words to describe the difficulty in saying good-bye to the religious sisters, priests, and my new family. All of them would miss Fr. Victor and I – since together we were the life of the party. My Lord Bishop Julius would say he would never be satisfied with words to express his gratefulness to us. I replied, a simple Bishop blessing would suffice. With that Bishop Julius would bless Fr. Victor and I as we departed for Abuja.

God was truly watching over us because aside from a questionnaire check about COVID symptoms we had a straightforward journey home. We flew to 6 hours to Germany and then a 13+ hour flight direct to Las Vegas, then drive to Kingman. It was a miracle that we got out on that day. The next day Sr. Nina was to depart from Abuja and ended up spending 2 days sleeping at the airport. All flights canceled due to COVID. On the third day, on a different airline managed to get a seat on a plane. It would only be about 10 days later that US went on lock down.

Final Reflection: There was a black and white picture posted on social media whereby a toddler was obviously sick grasping both sides of a toilet and his sister (about 4 years old, I guess) was patting his back. The description said that a sister was helping her toddler brother who was battling cancer and was sick from chemotherapy. One posted comment said it all – *I no longer have any problems*. Its true when you experience Christ in others. This is my trip to Nigeria in a nutshell, a faith filled and constant encounter with Christ. Love of others at its highest point.

After a few months, the Muslim militants who kidnapped and murdered the seminarian Michael were finally caught. If you remember, the militants jump over seminary walls and kidnapped 4 seminarians. They released 3 but murdered Michael by shooting him in the back as he was 'released'. They interrogated the militants asking them why they killed Michael. The response was sobering. They killed him because **he would not stop preaching the Gospel**. This gained worldwide attention and locally one of the priests in our Diocese told me that I witnessed a future saint's funeral.





I often think of the Papal Nuncio from village outside of Milan. When COVID hit Italy, the hotspot was around Milan. I worried about his family and friends. Hundreds had died with COVID in that area. Italy has lost hundreds of religious sisters and priests from COVID.

Bishop Julius Kundi and Bishop George Dodo are of course struggling with the COVID pandemic too and how to serve God's people. The closure of their country left many without food, water, sick, dying alone. There are no savings accounts or extra money, as most live day to day. Contrast the closure of the US, where we complained about not having toilet paper. Remarkably, in keeping contact with them, both are trying to lift me up and remain hopeful. God is our strength, one writes. God will provide, another text. Such hope is why I decided to share this trip. Hope is the one virtue that I have always struggled with. Faith is our relationship with God. Love is God and how we share that love with others. I have always tied hope to the resurrection when someone dies, but not much farther than that. But now I have a deeper appreciation in hope. Hope is staying focused on our Lord and Savior, Christ Jesus and believing that in every moment, good/bad, sick/health, pandemic/starvation/persecutions, we know and believe God is there. It is in Him where hope remains.

How can we share in this hope? We pray for the people of Diocese of Zaria and Kafanchan, their Bishops and clergy. We support them in our hearts as they continue to supply this world both men and women in consecrated life and priesthood. As I type this on 8-17-2020, there are 52 more murdered Christians in Kaduna State and at this week's Angelus, Pope Francis asked everyone to pray for northern Nigeria. Let keep praying (and perhaps a day of fasting) for our brothers and sisters in faith, for our clergy and most especially our Catholic Bishops who must shepherd His sheep through a global pandemic. To quote Bishop George Dodo, "Catholics take care of each other" and we do that united in faith and love. God Bless.

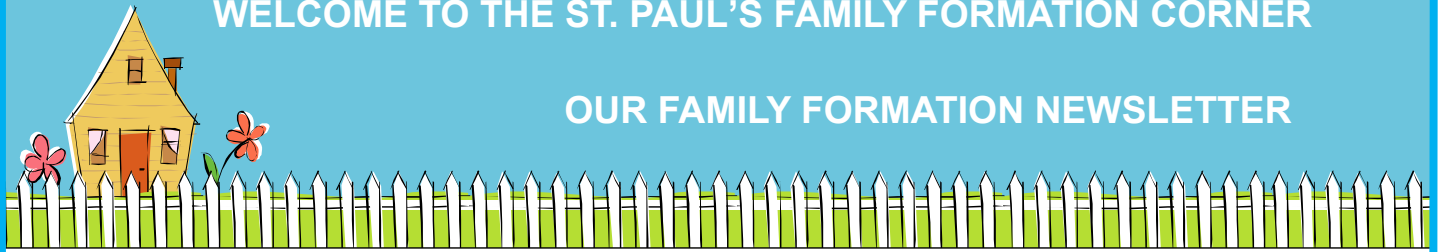

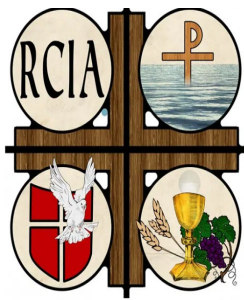

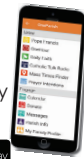
