

TRADE YOUR TALENTS



Sean Adams as of August 8th, 2019 is the fastest reader in the world. Sean can read 3,850 words per minute, which is about 17 minutes faster than a normal person. It means Sean could read many books and articles in a day, and still will have sufficient time for chores and family. Such wonderful talents are designed by God to express His unique presence in our life. However, people may discipline themselves to develop skills and techniques of doing other things. But, it is important to note that geniuses are born not made. For instance Kim Ung-yong of Korea started talking when he was six months old. At 8 months he solved algebra, and at two years old he could speak Korean, Japanese, English, and Chinese languages. Kim got his Doctorate at the age of 15; as at the time of this report he lectures at Colorado University USA. In the world artists, scientists, athletes and educators have shown extraordinary abilities to highlight the glory of God.

The dynamics of endowments can be all encompassing, as it can be seen in the five students that heard about Rachel, an elderly, lonely, and fragile woman in their neighborhood. Francis asked to know what can be done to help her; Jane offered to design an inspirational card that will uplift her spirit to be signed by five of them. Anthony donated food stuff that will last Rachel days, and Judith took the responsibility of maintaining Rachel's house while Edward volunteered to check on Rachel and run errands periodically. The five

friends above have exhibited their gifts generously; they shared their time and put their act of kindness together in order to serve humanity.

God bestows His powers upon us, before assigning responsibilities to us so as to maintain a relationship with His lovely people; *"The treasure comes from God— the vocation may come early, it may come late; it may come as it did to St. Francis, who was riding to a knightly contest in Apulia, or it may come after a life of sin, as it did to Augustine when he heard the voice of a child making reference to the scriptures: 'Take and read'"* (Treasure in Clay, Fulton Sheen P.29). The book of Ecclesiastes chapter 3 versus 1 to 8 lists all that can be done within time, from birth to death. The difficulty of considering the task given to humanity by God to work on, is within space and time. Although God allows mankind to reflect on time, yet humanity cannot exhaust the mysteriousness of God. The Catholic Church as a mother and teacher is playing host to the deposit of faith, traditions, ceremonies and feasts practiced by the Church. In addition, for 2,000 years apologetics, theologians, ascetics and diocesan administrators paddled the Church through difficulties and challenges. It has been made clear, that God has bestowed humanity with unique talents, to be harnessed for a deeper relationship with God.


