WATCH OUT!

REV. ISHAYA SAMAILA, PAROCHIAL VICAR

Once upon a time, there was a lion that grew old and unable to hunt for its food. So, it pretended to be sick, in order to pounce on its unsuspecting sympathizers for meals. Therefore, the victims of the lion had their footprints going into its cave, *but not coming out*. It was the turn of fox to visit the ailing lion; fox decided to stay by the entrance of the cave. The lion requested that fox should come into the cave; but the staggering reality (how sympathizers were made preys) was comprehended by the fox. So, the fox informed the other animals on the evil intention of the lion. The lesson from this story is, to always stay alert and active in resisting temptations.

Priests, deacons, bishops, cardinals and the pope offer millions of homilies, exhortations, encyclicals and sermons to persuade the catholic faithful to be on the alert. Such lessons are drawn from scriptural accounts, traditions of the Church and contemporary events. Abraham, our father in faith, discerned to follow the path of God having in mind the signs of his time, in spite its challenges. Similarly, David's royalty did not deter him from appreciating God and His instructions. The ideal people of God have Him as their center, and immerse themselves in doing things that will keep them in touch with Him. Therefore, through the ages, the church has witnessed priests, monks, devotees, and the faithful call on believers to be on guard against challenges. This can be seen in the messages that confront communism, capitalism, modernism, scientific human modifications.



Recent technological advancement seen as achievement, in my opinion, has put humanity in a form of detachment, isolation, and aloofness away from a culture that appreciates togetherness and sharing. It is obvious, we have come a long way in making things more convenient and easier. In any case, human life should not be compromised come what may (life dignified from natural birth to death). So-called achievements turn obsolete if people cannot have responsible and honest leadership as expected across the strata of human society. There seems to be a shift in values and priorities which has adversely affected cultures, morality, beliefs, and relationships. Humanity as a pilgrim, is aware of the transition from this world to another. Our ancestors have gone before us, leaving behind their loved ones and valuables in the world. Every living person has the opportunity to develop a relationship with God in order to be saved, we should not procrastinate.

Jesus Christ offers us eternal life, which we acquire by operating in the physical world. The signs of the end are here: earthquakes, tornadoes, floods, droughts, hurricanes, conflicts, wars, and other disasters. The season of Advent and Christmas brings to mind the love God has lavished on humanity; the gift of His only beloved son (Jesus Christ). The incarnation (the taking human form) of Jesus has given humanity the opportunity to share in God's divinity. However, the faithful are required to cooperate with God so as to always distinguish friend from foe.


