

Update on COVID Precaution



COMPASSIONATE REST

REV. ISHAYA SAMAILA, PAROCHIAL VICAR



Come to me, all of you who labor and are overburdened, and I will give you rest. Shoulder my yoke and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. Yes, my yoke is easy and my burden light (Matthew 11:28-30).

The disciples of Jesus worked so hard, in changing the story line of the people they served. Many beneficiaries regained their freedom from demonic possessions and other illnesses caused by the devil and his agents. The invitation to be in a quiet place was, for the disciples to be rejuvenated and to evaluate the great events they witnessed in their ministry. Jesus and his disciples desired to be in a quiet atmosphere, but the immediate community members needed them more than they could imagine. Urgent matters at hand abruptly suspended the vacation the disciples of Jesus should have had.

Corporal works of mercy (feeding the hungry, giving water to the thirsty, visiting the sick, visiting those in prison, clothing the naked, burying the dead, and accommodating the homeless) require that we put ourselves in the positions of serving the needs of others, even if it means condoning inconveniences. The essence of life is not about oneself, rather, it is about how others are impacted positively. Jesus Christ remains a model to humanity, he left his comfort zone, in order to live and teach emulative life in this world. The needy are always with us from one generation to another, seeking succor as in the days of Jesus Christ; we need to configure ourselves into another Christ for


our generation. The need to alleviate the suffering of others around us should be a collective responsibility. Whatever a neighbor needs should be given all round attention and whatsoever is required in order to uphold human dignity. Therefore, to be relevant to people in need should draw the attention of everybody, from all walks of life.

The roots of the gospel portray Jesus as a physician, a teacher, welfare agent, a steward, and a chief mourner to the people that encountered him. The ministry of Jesus was selfless to the extent his apostles could not have time for themselves. Jesus taught and gave instructions, however, he practiced a pattern of life that appeared ideal in the eyes of the world. The need to attend to the crowd that came to him was beyond their state of mind and disposition;

notwithstanding, he (Jesus) bypasses human standards in order to avail his audience divine experience. The crowd (disciples) that went looking for Jesus at such a crucial moment, challenges us into being alert to looking for help whenever situations get out of control. To have an encounter with Jesus Christ is the desire of every disciple, so as to be transformed. But, turning the crowd away unattended might have been disastrous and further contradicts what Jesus represents. They were victims of depression, injustice, marginalization, harassment, loneliness, and suppression which were facilitated by a culture of alienated leaders. This generation like other generations, need Jesus to make a difference in the life of individuals and communities.


