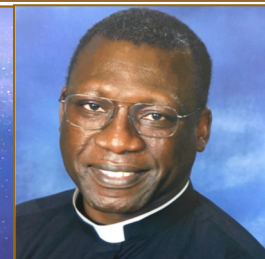

*GIVE THEM SOMETHING TO EAT*  
*REV. ISHAYA SAMAILA, PAROCHIAL VICAR*



According to 2021 global hunger survey, 690 million people across the world starve, without sufficient food to live healthy life. As statistics show many people die daily all over the world especially children for lack of calories. The United Nations' report shows the production of foods has drastically improved; however, its distribution is still far from reaching the required goal. It is imperative for the rest of the world to concentrate on massive production of food, not acquiring all sorts of weapons in order to give way to humanitarian projects like food security, availability of health services, welfare, and basic amenities.

Food is an important element in human life; although, food production and preparation have been going through modifications from one generation to another, however, what food is to mankind remains the same. Food is important in every event, family gathering, celebrations and ceremonies, it is displayed for nourishment, energy, and refreshment. Most dietitians are of the opinion that food can serve as protective, preventive, and for curative purposes as the nutrients and vitamins in them supply the body all that are required to live well.

The Old Testament figured God feeding the hungry out of His magnanimity as a way to sustain them and to keep the plan He had going. For so many reasons the Passover meal was symbolic as it marked Israelites' freedom, and as well it highlighted His presence as their leader. Another moment that God demonstrated care to His people was during their journey to the promised

land as they were starving, He provided manna to sustain them on their way to promised land. Basically, God in the Old Testament provided food to strengthen His people that were stranded in the middle of no where: *"Then he (Elijah) lay down and went to sleep. But an angel touched him and said, 'Get up and eat'. He looked round, and there at his head was a scone baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank..."* (1Kings 19:5-6).

The feeding of the five thousand disciples that went to listen to Jesus was an eye opener. However, the same way God fed His special people in the Old Testament, similarly, Jesus Christ did as



well, although, he was neither a politician nor a wealthy person, but, through the divine intervention of God he was able to feed his audience that were weak, malnourished, and restless. As usual, Jesus did not do the miracle of multiplying food, in order to attract attention to himself, but, rather

he did it out of necessity to save people from collapsing on their way back home. Worthy of note is the compassion and generosity of Jesus Christ in multiplying the food, which foreshadows the institution of the Holy Eucharist, where and when the body and blood of Jesus Christ are made available to feed members of the community of God's people. It is obvious that the media, politicians, religious leaders, and non-governmental agencies are unanimous in admitting the menace of spiritual, moral, and physical hunger across the world. Individually and collectively we need to take our responsibilities.

## An Update on Debt Reduction

Starting the fiscal year, July 1, 2020, our Loan Balance was \$560,180.

Finishing the fiscal year, June 30, 2021, our Loan Balance is \$473,495.

Because of your generosity, the parishioners of St. Paul's, and the commitment made to pay down the parish debt, we would like to share with you that during this past fiscal year our debt has been reduced by \$86,685. We continue to pay our regular monthly installment, as well as an additional principal payment of \$25,000 made in June 2021.
