

JESUS, YOU ARE THE SOURCE OF LIFE Rev. Ishaya Samaila, Parochial Vicar



"Faith is (therefore), a divinely infused virtue by which man believes, on God's authority, what God has revealed and teaches through His Holy Church. Saint Paul calls faith "The substance of things to be hoped for, and the evidence of things that appear not" (Hebrews 11:1) (The 12 Steps to Holiness and Salvation, Saint Alphonsus Liguori, P.1). In the Old and New Testaments, God takes the responsibility of revealing Himself to humanity, not as a master manipulating his servants, but by way of partnership to the extent mankind has the freedom to make choices and act accordingly.

In the ministry of Jesus Christ the baseline question was, do you have faith or do you believe? For ones faith to play a role, it does not necessarily GESUS our source of everything

require one to be a theologian, a priest, a Nun, a spiritual guru, or lavish every hard earned income. Rather, what is required is an inner disposition, and adequate time that will lead us into what spiritual directors may refer to as dying to oneself, to allow God to use us instruments so as to impact the lives of others around. Some jesters may think our God maybe so weak and helpless, for requiring the services and sacrifice of humanity to accomplish His plan. Just as in the incarnation of our Lord, Jesus Christ; he had an identity that was familiar to humanity with all the required originality, not in any way strange. Therefore, to be responsive and to competently carry out the assignment given to him, he had to humble himself to the end (passion, death, and resurrection).

The deposit of Catholic faith which is imbedded in her traditions and in the practice of the liturgy makes her unique in a spectacular way. The celebration of sacraments, worship rites, the signs and symbols used in the Church deepens the faith of the faithful. Similarly, the word of God plays a pivotal role in the teaching of lessons, moral and spiritual. The Catholic Church does not compromise with other religions nor the society (governments) that confronts her values in any

form. Instead, it serves as a conscience to the society through defining human dignity, rights, freedom, rights to worship, and justice.

Therefore, the Catholic Church as a God-centered

religious organization has impacted the lives of humanity for over two thousand years. This is reflected in her promotion of education, contribution to health sector, and drawing followers into deeper relationship with God.

Faith is the yardstick which determines our encounter with God and His people. To make the best out of our relationship with God, we have to trust Him, commit ourselves completely, and to obey His instructions without reservations. Today, humanity wants miracles, goodness, abundance, happiness, joy, enjoyment, pleasure, and excitement without any form of commitment to the will of God. Jesus Christ invites us to, "Set your hearts on His (God's) kingdom first, and on his righteousness, and all these other things will be given you as well" (Matthew 6:33).






