

Why are we chanting Greek, Latin?

For September & October, we are encouraging our parishioners to learn chanting our Mass Parts in Latin as our preparation for Advent. Chant is sung without accompanying harmony or instruments and it is best to sing it in Latin. We sing in unison as one Body, one voice. It is not so much thinking in another language, as recognizing that the text is embedded, becoming second nature to us, feeding us. The Latin text – and its vehicle, the chant – provide us, as it were, with a distilled spirit, from which we can taste the goodness of the Lord.

Fr. Ishaya's Reflection



If a man serves me, he must follow me, where I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honor him (John 12:26).

Christology commentators are of the opinion: Jesus Christ was a silent revolutionary. He moved on from a culture that condoned slave masters to a lifestyle that had sympathy for the downtrodden and the vulnerable. Iesus solicits for a world where everybody will serve others in need; which in a way emphasizes on the fact that

we need each other. order to make progress in life. The of **Iesus** ministry reached out to the lowly, the sick, the poor, and the marginalized. He had the needy close to him and he attended to them based on their needs.

SURBER SERVA I PETER 2: 18-25 ISAIAH 53

The list of professionals

that are serving humanity is endless, and their services cuts across all walks of life; trained to impact the lives of others. By and large, their responsibilities contribute towards coordinating and organizing the orderliness of human life. However, any feelings of irrelevance and moral temptations may lead dynamic members of the society into difficulties that they cannot be resolved without God. They have to partner with God for a solution; otherwise, they may do something that may devastate the sanctity of life.

It was the suffering of Jesus Christ that sealed human salvation. Therefore, Jesus sees himself as a 'sacrificial lamb,' 'suffering servant' whose blood expiates human sin which serves as a sign of the new covenant. The Old Testament covenant had the tablets (Ark of the Covenant) as a symbol of the presence of God; however, in the New Testament Iesus Christ was the full representation of God. As the disciples of Jesus, we are called into configuring our lives after him. We come in contact with people from different all walks of life that require to be served humbly, honestly, lovely, and selflessly. We should always remember that we are the personification (alter Christus) of Jesus Christ to our generation.

> The Latin word minister stands for the English derivation of 'a servant,' a person who leads religious worship. government appointment, or community leadership. However, interpretation of the word leaves one with nuances. those as bearing the title 'minister' mav not

necessarily serve the people entrusted to them as expected by the members of the community. Instead, they may take advantage of those offices, so as to acquire powers and to draw unnecessary attention to themselves. On the other hand, they relegate the people they are supposed to serve and identify with. The need for service without bias may help boost the efforts of those in positions of leadership to make positive changes and progress. Jesus Christ earned human salvation through the cross: therefore, the title of the 'Son of God' got its complete meaning in the 'suffering servant.' Jesus Christ calls on his disciples to avoid distractions, in order to carry out divine assignments with sense of purpose.
