The Day of the Dead

(Spanish: Día de Muertos or Día de los Muertos) is a holiday celebrated on the 1st and 2nd of November. It originated and is mostly observed in Mexico but also in other places, especially by any people of Mexican heritage elsewhere.

Although also associated with the Catholic celebrations of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day, it has a less solemn tone and is portrayed as a holiday of joyful celebration rather than mourning.

The multi-day holiday also involves family and friends gathering to pay respects and to remember friends and family members who have died.

These celebrations can also take a humorous tone, as some celebrants remember funny events and unusual anecdotes about the departed.

The traditions connected with the holiday include honoring all of the deceased using calaveras and aztec marigold flowers which are known as cempazúchitl, and building home altars called ofrendas with some of the favorite foods and beverages of the departed, and visiting graves with these items also as gifts for the deceased.

The celebration is not solely focused on the dead, as it is also common to give gifts to friends such as candy sugar skulls, to share traditional pan de muerto with family and friends, and to write light-hearted and often irreverent verses in the form of mock epitaphs dedicated to living friends and acquaintances, a literary form known as calaveras literarias.

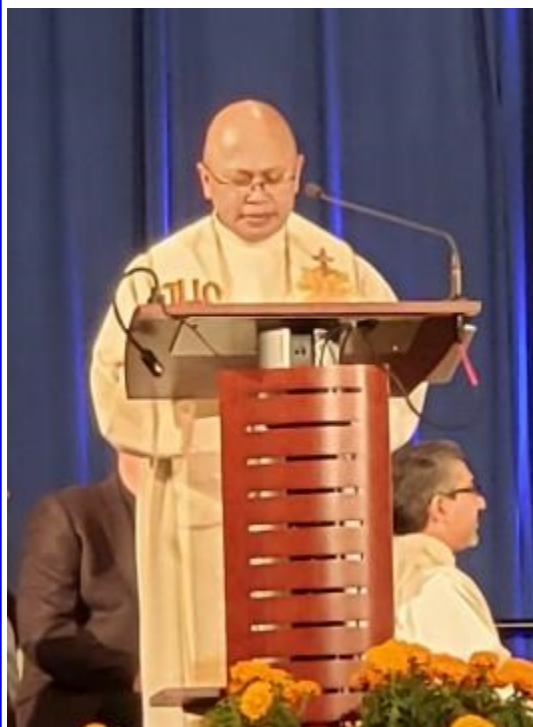

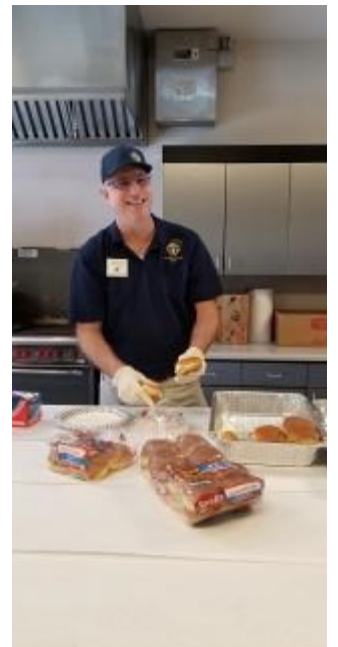

All in all it was a most successful event even though the total attendance was down from previous years. We had more Knights in attendance than at any other event since the pandemic started.



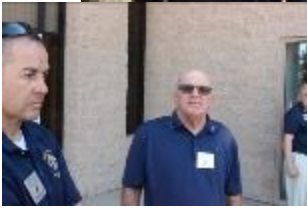

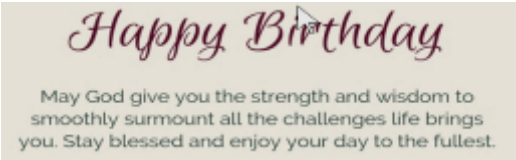
