

First Reading: Acts 14: 21-27 (BBpg.160)

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to that city and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch. They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith.

"War is what happens when language fails." "Only the dead have seen the end of war." "The true soldier fights not because he hates what is in front of him, but because he loves what is behind him" (quotabulary.com).

The world seems to be filled with hate, animosity, and vindictiveness which maybe glaring in relationships and interactions. In the new teaching of Jesus Christ, love is its core which requires us to serve and care for the needs of others in our community. However, mankind to some extent is entangled in individualism which devastates a culture of togetherness, sharing, and concern for the welfare of others. As observed among babies; they are open to generous gift of love through care (touch); however, whenever they do not get it for a moment they cry for attention. There is an innate natural desire for humans to love its kind; while, on the other hand, an extra energy is required to hate another person. Jesus is clamoring for humans to live according to its nature by making others to feel good.

God created the universe out of love. Therefore, God loved us first and He requires love from us through obedience and faithfulness. However, from one generation to another humanity dents our relationship with God and with fellow humans, out of self-centeredness and disobedience. The need to impact the lives of others is needed more than ever before, as divisions are on the increase due to numerous factors. Having the commandments, the

Rather, both scriptures and traditions are always unanimous in encouraging disciples to love and serve God and His people unconditionally.

The world encountered wars, conflicts, and other man made disasters that terminated millions of lives and many more left devastated. Other creatures in the world had never engaged themselves in meaningless killings to prove their pride or dominance in a world owned by God. The presence of Jesus is for human redemption and reconciliation, in order to reach a complete image and likeness of God through selfless service. The contents of the Old and New Testaments are disclosure of divine love through the patriarchs, the prophets, the priests, the kings, and the

disciples. Some Biblical commentators are of the opinion that the scripture is a narrative of the love story of God for His people. Saint Paul sees divine love thus: *Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offense, and it is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes* (1Corinthians13:4-7).


