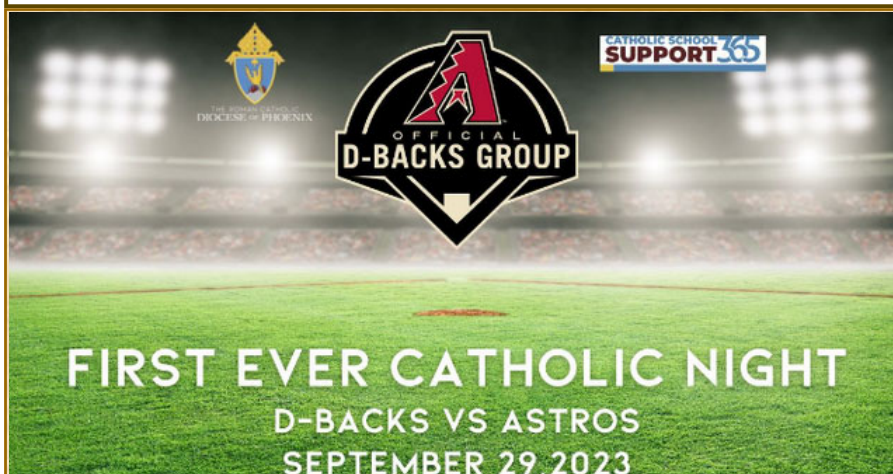

Living the Eucharist

“If I had to go miles and miles over burning coals in order to receive Jesus, I would say the way was easy, as if I were walking on a carpet of roses. “ – St. Catherine of Genoa

The Real Presence of Jesus in our tabernacles is a Divine Mystery. During Holy Mass at the moment of the Consecration, when the priest pronounces Jesus’ divine words, “This is My Body..... This is the chalice of My Blood” (Matthew 26:26-27), the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus. The substances of bread and wine are no longer there because they have been changed, “transubstantiated” into the Divine Body and Blood of Jesus. The bread and wine keep only their appearances, to express the reality of food and drink, according to Jesus’ words, “My Flesh is real food, and My Blood is real drink” (John 6:56).

This is the beginning of deepening our relationship with the Holy Eucharist. When we unite our own mind, heart and will, we can then LIVE the Eucharist.

With the mind, it is the intensive way we focus and meditate on the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist. We are attentive, orderly, reverent, and abandon other thoughts. “Emptying ourselves” in mind, heart, and spirit. We let our minds ponder deeply this Mystery of Love.

Have you ever “exercised” your mind and pondered on any of the Eucharistic Miracles? Father Bruno recently mentioned in his homilies on Corpus Christi, one miracle called the Eucharistic Miracle of Lanciano (in Italy). Twelve centuries ago, a monk of the Order of St. Basil was deeply afflicted by doubts about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Just as he had finished the Consecration, the bread and wine suddenly changed into blood and flesh. This consecrated Host and Blood has been preserved in this state for more than a thousand years. The most recent chemical analysis of a particle of the Host verified the fact that it is indeed a piece of living flesh which is part of a human heart. Proving that the Eucharist is indeed a living heart! The full story is well worth Googling since you can see pictures of the Host and read about the blood type, myocardium cells (heart cells), and the 5 portions of Blood which miraculously weigh the same individually as well as combined.

We exercise our minds by reading scripture and books about the Holy Eucharist. Understandably, our minds are very “small” and cannot comprehend the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist on its own. Living the Mystery of the Eucharist entails mind, heart, and will (action). To explore the riches of the Eucharist, we also need the heart. Every Christian must love Jesus Christ! Sounds simple, but if you don’t love Jesus, you cannot fall in love with the Eucharist. Eucharistic love must spring from the heart and be ever alive in us all. How can you exercise your heart for the Holy Eucharist? One profound practice is Adoration. Spending time in front of the tabernacle and letting your heart “go”. More on the benefits of Adoration later.

What is an annulment?

An annulment is a declaration, after an extensive investigation, that a marriage bond was not created at the time of the wedding. An annulment is not a divorce; it is a statement that the bond of marriage, as it is understood by the Catholic Church, was never created due to the presence of some factor recognized in law as preventing a valid bond.

Why can the Catholic Church conduct such an investigation?

The Catholic Church does not believe, due to the teaching of Jesus Christ (Matthew 19), that anyone, Catholic or not, can divorce and remarry. A marriage is considered valid and binding until death unless proven otherwise. However, the Church does believe that under certain circumstances the stated wedding vows, that should have created marriage, did not rise to a valid and binding bond. The annulment process is an investigation into the consent of the parties to see if the marriage is valid and binding.

How do I know if I need to petition for an annulment?

If you have ever been civilly divorced and feel that your marriage is invalid, you would like to become Catholic, or would like to get married in the Catholic Church, you should petition for an annulment.
