

Feast of the Queenship of Mary

Queen of Heaven (Latin: Regina Caeli) is a title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary by Christians mainly of the Catholic Church and, to a lesser extent, in Anglicanism, Lutheranism, and Eastern Orthodoxy. The title has long been a tradition, included in prayers and devotional literature and seen in Western art in the subject of the Coronation of the Virgin from the High Middle Ages, long before it was given a formal definition status by the Church.

The Catholic teaching on this subject is expressed in the papal encyclical Ad Caeli Reginam, issued by Pope Pius XII in 1954. It states that Mary is called Queen of Heaven because her Son, Jesus Christ, is the King of Israel and the heavenly king of the universe; indeed, the Davidic tradition of Israel recognized the mother of the king as the queen mother of Israel.

The Queenship of Mary is a Marian feast day in the liturgical calendar of the Catholic Church, created by Pope Pius XII. On 11 October 1954, the pontiff pronounced the new feast; it was celebrated on May 31, the last day of the Marian month. The initial ceremony for this feast involved the crowning of the Salus Populi Romani icon of Mary in Rome by Pius XII as part of a procession in Rome.

In 1969, Pope Paul VI moved the feast day to August 22, the former Octave day of the Assumption, in order to emphasize the close bond between Mary's queenship and her glorification in body and soul next to her Son. The Second Vatican Council's Constitution on the Church states that "Mary was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory and exalted by the Lord as Queen of the universe, that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son" (Lumen Gentium, 59).

The movement to officially recognize the Queenship of Mary was initially promoted by several Catholic Mariological congresses in Lyon, France; Freiburg, Germany; and Einsiedeln, Switzerland. Fr. Gabriel Roschini founded in Rome, Italy, an international society to promote the Queenship of Mary, Pro Regalitate Mariae. Several popes had described Mary as Queen and Queen of Heaven, which was documented by Gabriel Roschini. Pope Pius XII repeated the title in numerous encyclicals and apostolic letters, especially during World War II. Mary Queen of heaven, pray for us.

Joyful Reception of the Holy Eucharist

Revival

One of the earliest reports of a mystical reception of Holy Communion is that of St. Clement, Bishop of Ancyra. St. Clement was ordained to the holy priesthood at the age of 18, and at twenty was consecrated as Bishop of Ancyra (Ancyra is in present day Turkey). For those who are historian fans, St. Clement lived during the Diocletian period in Rome. Diocletian was the emperor of Rome, and he was consumed with the concern of the number of Christians. He was adamant that the problems with the Roman Empire's finances and ongoing struggles were due to the growing religion of Christianity. Emperor Diocletian demanded all people to return to the Roman gods with sacrifices and he in fact thought himself as a living god and insisted everyone prostrate themselves before him and kiss the hem of his robe.

Jews and Christians refused to consider any emperor as god or sacrifice to other gods. As the number of Christians increased, Diocletian ordered the destruction of all churches and Christian texts. Throughout this Great Persecution, the Christians refused to yield. St. Clement was one of the leading members of the clergy who were arrested and ordered to sacrifice to Roman god or die. St Clement firmly confessed his faith and valiantly withstood all tortures. St. Clement was suspended on a tree, smashed his mouth with stones, and turned him on a wheel and burned him over a low fire. The Lord persevered His Bishop and healed his lacerated body. The emperor Diocletian himself, received a report that Bishop Clement had been fiercely tortured, but told it had no effect on his body. Diocletian, seeing the martyr completely healthy, had subjected him to even crueler and inhumane tortures, and then had him locked up in prison.

However, while imprisoned, St. Clement evangelized to his fellow prisoners with his patience, inspired words, and his compliance with the will of God. As he converted the prisoners, they asked to be baptized, which were held in the middle of the night so not to alert the guards.

During one night as St. Clement was baptizing, the entire cell became illuminated by an extraordinary light. Through this light stepped a handsome young man clothed in shining garments. The man walked toward St. Clement and gave him a chalice and a large Host, and then disappeared. St. Clement divided the Host among the astonished witnesses and shared the contents of the chalice. History relates that the converted prisoners were so elated to receive Communion, that the next day joyfully went to their execution praising the Lord Jesus.

Then Christians of Ancyra freed Saint Clement from prison and took him to a cave church. There, after celebrating Liturgy, the Saint announced to the faithful the impending end of the persecution and his own martyrdom. On January 23, the holy hierarch was killed by soldiers from the city, who stormed the church. The Saint was beheaded as he stood before the altar and offered the Bloodless Sacrifice. Two deacons were beheaded with him, but no one else was harmed.

Learning about the history of our early church Saints and Martyrs opens a profound door of gratefulness for the ability to receive Holy Communion. How do you receive Holy Communion? Is it with the great grateful reverence it deserves? So many Saints and Martyrs, named and unnamed, have died for Our Savior. Next time you receive Communion, reflect on the number of Holy men and women who received Holy Communion with joyful praise, even grateful for dying for the Lord. St. Clement, pray for us, help us to gratefully receive the Blessed Sacrament. Amen!

Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2, 2020, till February 2022 and finally, it is picking up now.

It is very important to support them at this critical time since they have no income and there is no government to take care of them and help them. In order to survive, they turned to Christian communities in the United States to purchase their articles.

These hand carved religious articles are beyond description. Carved from wood of the sacred Olive tree, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years. It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income and are able to stay living and survive in the Holy Land.
