The Word of God, Catechesis in Three Parts

Sacred Scriptures

"When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God Himself speaks to His people, and Christ, present in His word, proclaims the Gospel" (GIRM, no. 29). These words from the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) set before us a profound truth that we need to ponder and make our own. The words of Sacred Scripture are unlike any other texts we will ever hear, for they not only give us information, but they are also the vehicle God uses to reveal Himself to us, how we come to know the depth of God's love for us, and the responsibilities entailed by being Christ's followers, members of His Body. What is more, this Word of God proclaimed in the liturgy possesses a special sacramental power to bring about in us what it proclaims. The Word of God proclaimed at Mass is 'efficacious' that is, it not only tells us of God and God's will for us, it also helps us to put that will of God into practice in our own lives. How, then, do we respond to this wonderful gift of God's Word? We respond in word and song, in posture and gesture, in silent meditation and, most important of all, by listening attentively to that Word as it is proclaimed. Following each reading we express our gratitude for this gift with the words "Thanks be to God" or, in the case of the Gospel, "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ," and it is appropriate that a brief period of silence be observed to allow for personal reflection. Following the first reading we sing the Responsorial Psalm, a meditation on God's word through the inspired words of one of the psalms from the psalter, the Bible's prayer book. Please, keep connected by reading next week part two. May God's Word enrich you.

Eucharistic Miracle WYD 2023

Revival

It is true, most of these writings I gather about the Eucharist are from several books and readings of the lives of the Saints. Unfortunately, not everyone connects with historical miracles as much as current. So, today's article is about a Eucharistic miracle that occurred just few weeks ago.

As many followed, Pope Francis celebrated Mass for the World Youth Day, held in Lisbon Portugal in early August. One of our young adult parishioners (Go Emma!) went to Portugal so we are blessed to have a representative from St. Paul! It was the first event after the COVID pandemic, and the theme was "Mary arose and went with hast."

God was moving among those in attendance. One blind teenager says she was miraculously healed during her pilgrimage to the event. Jimena, 16-year-old pilgrim to World Youth Day from Madrid, told Catholic News Agency she was miraculously **healed following reception of Holy Communion** during the Mass at World Youth Day. Jimena told CNA, "I opened my eyes, and I could see perfectly." According to reports, Jimena suffered with blindness for almost three years before the miracle due to myopia. Often referred to as "nearsighted", the condition was severe enough for Jimena that it left her 95 percent blind. The teenager credits the Blessed Mother for her restored sight.

Jimena was traveling to World Youth Day with a group from Opus Dei and was accompanied by the prayers and novenas from her friends and loved ones. Prior to leaving for her pilgrimage, **she organized a novena to Our Lady of the Snows.** She said it was on the feast day of Our Lady of Snows, August 5, that her sight was restored. She said she woke up on August 5 with her vision still the same as it had been for 2.5 years. She was unable to see and was getting emotional because she felt she was not going to be healed. It was, however, **after receiving the Lord in the Eucharist that she said that her prayers were answered, and her sight was restored.**

"We were at WYD and after receiving Communion I began to cry a lot, because it was the last day of the novena and I wanted to be cured and I had very much asked God please [cure me]," she told CNA. "It was overwhelming; very many thanks must be given for the miracle, because I saw the altar, the tabernacle, my girlfriends were there, and I could see them perfectly."

Of course, Jimena is in the process of having the Church validate miracle by doctors, but Cardinal Omella and others say it is considered a miracle for now. As there were media reports that focused on negative World Youth Day reports, such as smaller crowd than St. John Paul II, or Pope Francis' statements, but how can we allow this to overshadow this miracle. Her miracle came after the reception of the Holy Eucharist, during the year of Eucharistic Revival! And was credited from praying the Novena to our Blessed Mother. What else can convince Catholics that Jesus is present in the Holy Eucharist? Don't get distracted, like Jimena, focus on our faithful love of Mary and the Holy Eucharist. The Evil one enjoys such distractions. Let us stay away from news that separates, rather look to our Lord who unites us.

What prayers are in your heart when you are receiving the Holy Eucharist? How can we remain 'child-like' like Jimena, totally trusting in our Blessed Virgin Mother prayers and never giving up on asking for our miracle. There are so many miracles, what is yours? Do you lay your request before Him in the Holy Eucharist? Our Lady of Snows, Pray for Us!
