

The Word of God, Catechesis in Three Parts The Gospel

The Gospel is the highpoint of the Liturgy of the Word. The readings from the Old Testament tell us of God's promises and his preparation of His people for the coming of his Son; the epistles and other pre-Gospel New Testament readings offer the reflections of St. Paul and other contemporaries of the Lord on the life and message of Christ; in the Acts of the Apostles, we have a history of the early Church. We believe that all Scripture, the Old and New Testaments, is inspired by the Holy Spirit, but the Church has always given special honor to the Gospel because in the Gospel we have not simply the preparation for and prefiguring of Christ, nor reflections on His message, but the words and deeds of Christ Himself. The proclamation of the Gospel is surrounded with marks of respect and honor: the Gospel is read by an ordained minister, the deacon, or, when no deacon is present, by a priest; the Book of the Gospels is carried aloft with honor in the entrance procession and placed on the altar until the Gospel reading to show the unity of Scripture and Eucharist, of the table of the Word and the table of Christ's body and blood; just before the Gospel is read the Gospel book is carried in procession to the ambo to the accompaniment of an acclamation sung by the people; it may be incensed before the reading and is kissed at its conclusion; finally, all stand as the Gospel is proclaimed. Through this posture and through the honors paid to the book containing the Gospel, the Church pays homage to Christ who is present in His Word and who proclaims His Gospel. Please, keep connected by reading next week's part three. May God's Word enrich you.

HAND CARVED in BETHLEHEM

PLEASE STOP BY THE TABLES OF RELIGIOUS WARES (Nativity set, rosaries, statues, crucifixes, charms, etc.) AFTER ALL THE MASSES THE WEEKEND OF September 23/24.

Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2, 2020, till February 2022 and finally, it is picking up now.

It is very important to support them at this critical time since they have no income and there is no government to take care of them and help them. In order to survive, they turned to Christian communities in the United States to purchase their articles.

These hand carved religious articles are beyond description. Carved from wood of the sacred Olive tree, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years.

It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income and are able to stay living and survive in the Holy Land.

Sadly enough, the Christian population has dropped from 22 % to less than 2% in the last 20 years. Thank you in advance for your support.

This is My Body

A spiritual disaster is when a Catholic doesn't recognize an encounter with Jesus. As a response to the unfavorable percentage of

Catholics who believe the host is just a symbol, Bishop Barron put together a small booklet for the Eucharistic Revival and made it affordable for parishes.

Bishop's booklet sets forth how the Bishops, together set forth what would become the Eucharistic Revival with three structures named, the **good**, the true and the beautiful. Under the rubric of the **good**, the revival would look at the social and ethical implications of our Eucharistic faith, the way to commitment to the poor and to social justice flows naturally from our reception of the Body and Blood of the Lord. Under the heading of the true, it would teach, catechize, and preach about the meaning of the Blessed Sacrament, especially the Real Presence of Jesus. And finally, under the prescript of the beautiful, the revival would draw attention to the liturgical and devotional practices that surround the Eucharist. (*This is my Body – Bishop Barron*)

I believe all these elements are captured in our Eucharistic prayer we say at every weekend Mass. Have you taken the time to reflect on the words and meaning? Please read slowly, there's a lot in one prayer!

Heavenly Father, we thank you for the gift of your Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, who promised to stay with us always, until the end of the age.

Reawaken our wonder at His presence in the Most Holy Eucharist. May our hearts burn within us as He opens the Scriptures and breaks the bread. Give us the eyes of faith to recognize His presence in our brothers and sisters, especially in the face of the poor and the suffering.

Nourished by the Eucharist, send us forth to walk faithfully as missionary disciples, proclaiming the Gospel to every heart and extending Your kingdom to every land. We ask this through Christ our Lord, Amen.

The good, we pray to recognize Jesus' presence in our brothers and sisters, especially in the face of the poor and suffering. The good theme is our call to be missionary disciples; send us forth to walk faithfully as missionary disciples. After reception of the Holy Eucharist, at the end of Mass, that is why we are commissioned to go out; 'this Mass is ended, go out to love and serve the Lord'. The reception of the Holy Eucharist requires us to go and serve those who are in need. Poverty is not a choice, but an injustice. The Holy Eucharist provides the nourishment to fight for the unborn, the hungry, the homeless, the lonely, those who grieve, all God's children! I saw a dynamic TikTok video saying, I don't want to get to heavenly gates "clean" because I lived as a good Catholic, rather I want to be battered & beaten carrying a neighbor on my back to heaven. Our commitment to the poor and to social justice flows naturally from our reception of the Body and Blood of the Lord.

For the themed heading **the true**, *Reawaken our wonder at His presence in the Most Holy Eucharist*. I pray that somehow, through our adoration efforts, homilies, this article series etc., we 'reawaken' your loving gaze into Jesus found in the Eucharist. Go to Adoration Chapel!

Finally, for the theme heading **the beautiful**, *may our hearts burn within us as He opens the Scriptures and breaks the bread!* Liturgy is the highest form of prayer. Our constant efforts and sacrifices to ensure we provide a liturgy with highest degree of devotion, reverence and prayer is at the center of our mission.

This weekend, let us devoutly say our Eucharistic Revival Prayer together with profound gratefulness for the Blessed Eucharist. Amen
