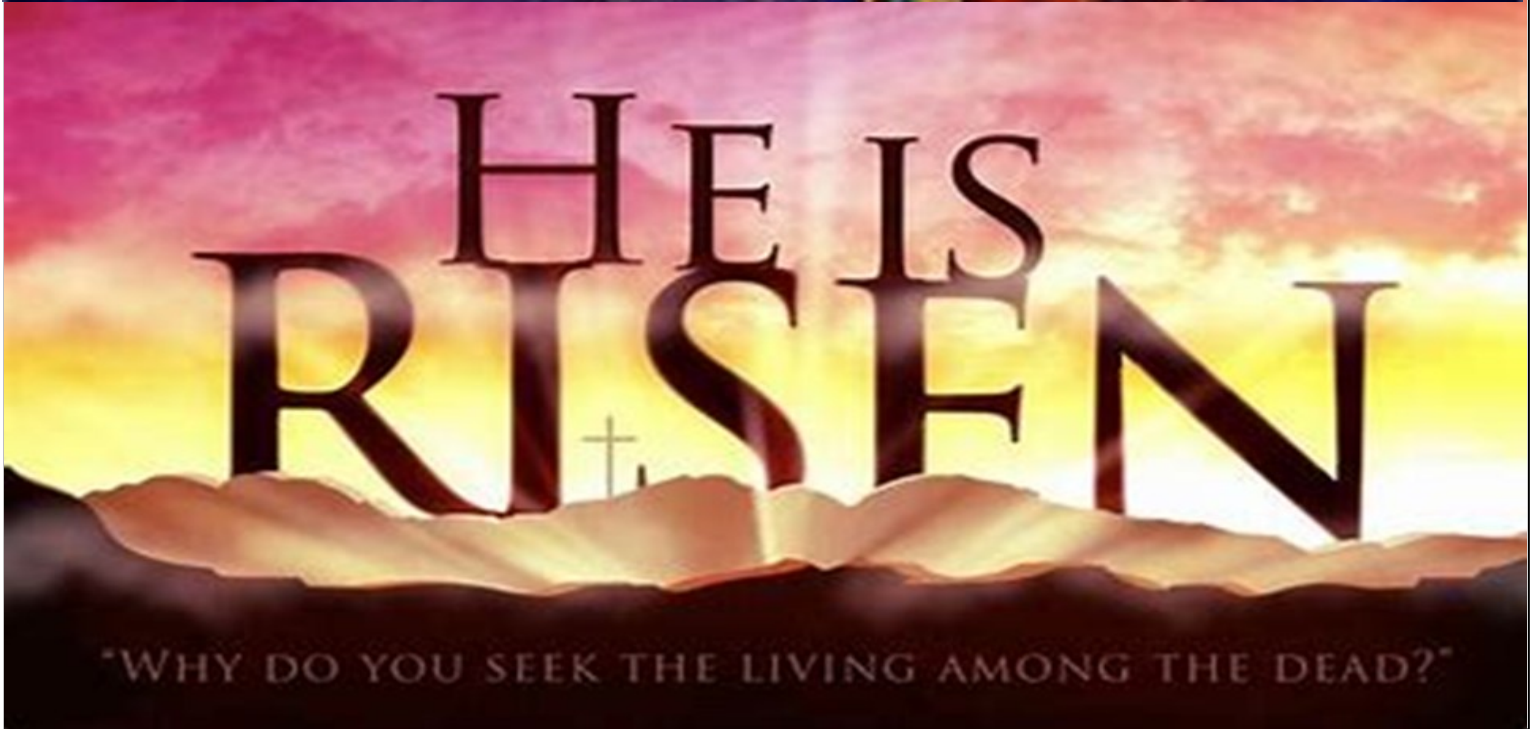

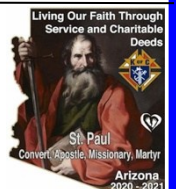

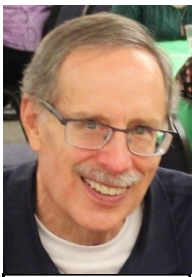

I regret not knowing Bob Kerrigan, Roger Madrid, Jack Connery as well as I knew Jim, Joe, Larry, and Ernie. As Brother Knights, I'm confident their lives have been touched by so many others.

Please join me this month of April in saying a powerful prayer each day from St. Gertrude the Great for the repose of souls of our Brother Knights; **Jim Pettit, Joe Gray, Larry Mackin, Bob Kerrigan, Roger Madrid, Jack Connery and Ernie Weege.**

St. Gertrude the Great was a 13th-century German Benedictine nun, writer and mystic who was graced with many heavenly visions. ERNE WEEGE HONOR FLIGHT RECIPIENT

September 14 thru 17, 2018

Brother Ernie's trip began from Phoenix. He flew to Milwaukee to join up with his fellow warriors.

They all departed from Milwaukee accompanied by a guide. In Ernie's case it was one of his sons.

They were sent off by a large crowd of well-wishers and an honor guard. Which included fire trucks sending streams of water over the plane as it departed. The plane was full. When they took off their plane was escorted off the runway by two vintage WWII aircraft.

They arrived in Baltimore to another large contingent of honor guards, military personnel, police and well-wishers.

They boarded 5 buses and proceeded to Washington D.C. under a police escort.

Ernie mentioned several times how humbling the experience was everywhere they went.

Under police escort they visited several war memorials as well as The Vietnam Wall and Arlington Cemetery. Everywhere they went they were sent off by and greeted on arrival at their destination by a crowd and escorted by police.



At the Vietnam Memorial Ernie found a fellow warrior that was killed at the barracks in Vietnam. He mentioned the constant mortar attacks that they came under when on the ground. Including Ernie. The Air force personnel he served with joked that they were safer in the air than on the ground.

At the Pentagon they were greeted by a very large contingent of military officers. Again, he mentioned how humbling the experience was. He also mentioned the Memorial erected there to remember the 9-11 attack. How well it was done. It honored the deceased on the plane as well as those killed at the Pentagon.

On the plane ride home, they had Mail Call. They were all presented with a large brown envelope with letters from the Governor and Senator of Wisconsin as well as many letters from school children. At the conclusion of the trip they were greeted once again by large crowds of all ages. Peers to small children.

On their deplaning back in Milwaukee they ran the gauntlet of Military honor guards to police to the crowd and lastly the Knights of Columbus. In all instances slapping them on the back, shaking hands and words of praise.



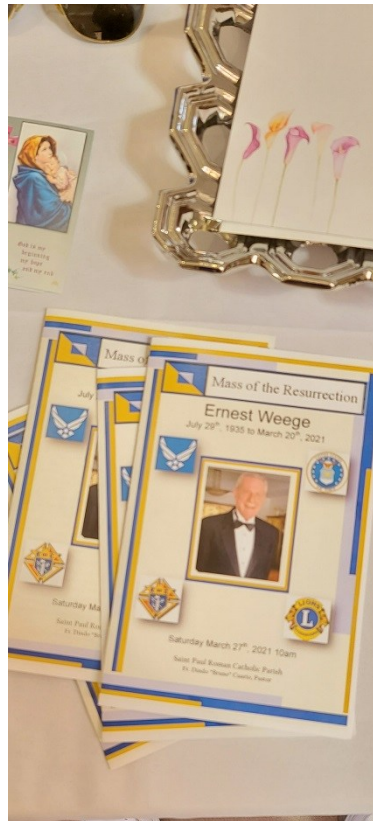
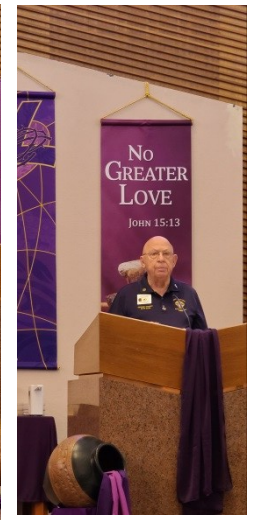
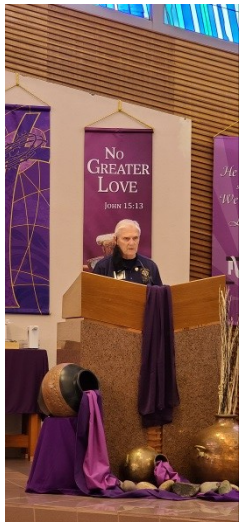
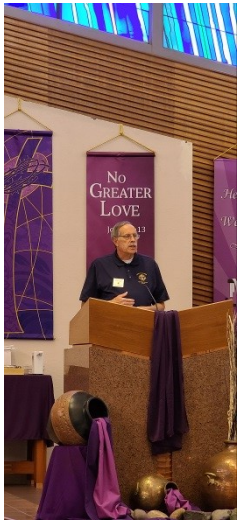

recommendation. He may also consult with three other Officers past and present of the Council to confirm a recommendation.

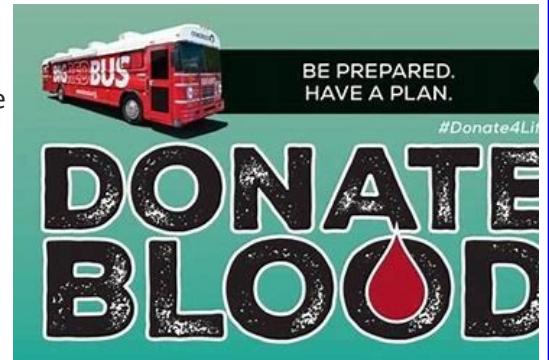


An award plaque shall be presented at either the Christmas party, Corporate Mass or the last meeting of a GK's term. (June)

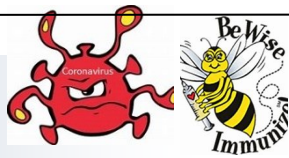

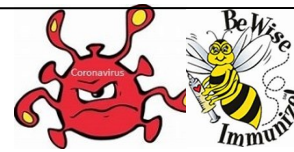

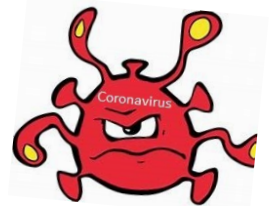
