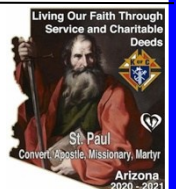

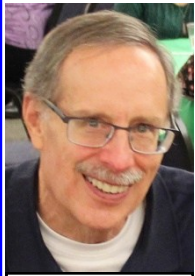

[AZ SEMINARIANS BENEFIT FROM LARRY MACKIN’S WISHES](#)

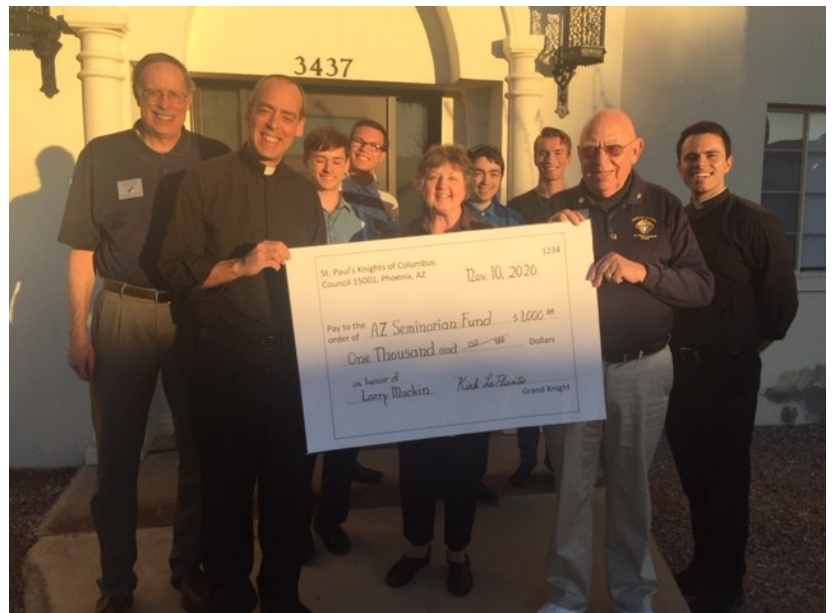

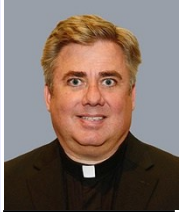

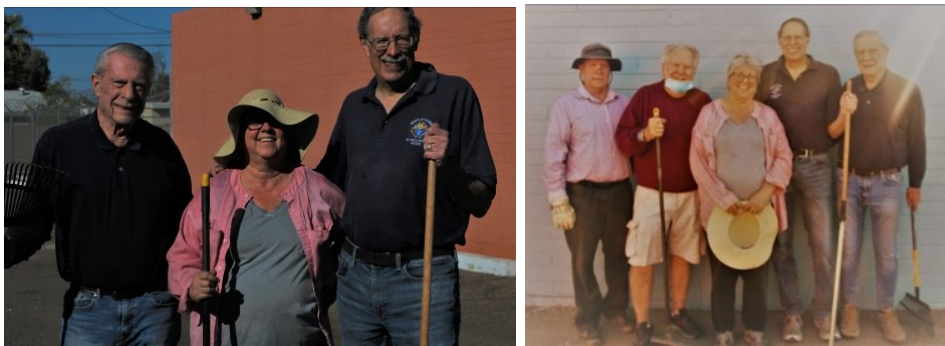
Let's give Fr. Aune a big Phoenix and Council 15001 welcome as an active member of the clergy and our Council.

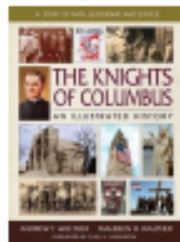


Arizona State Council Wants To Give Cash To Your Parish!

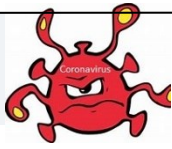

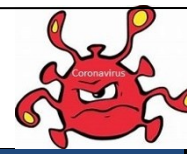

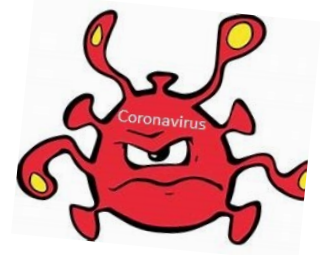
