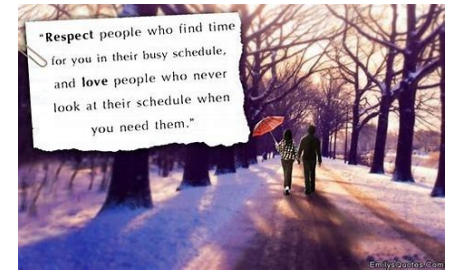
Brother Knights and families of Council 15001,

Earlier this month I attended Brother Andy Petti's Funeral Mass at St. Paul's.

One of the readings has stuck with me - Ecclesiastes 3: 1 – 8.

For everything there is a season, and

*A time for every matter under heaven;
A time to be born, and a time to die;
A time to plant, and a time to pluck up what we plant
A time to kill, and a time to heal;
A time to break down, and a time to build up.
A time to weep, and a time to laugh;
A time to mourn, and a time to dance.
A time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together;
A time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing.
A time to seek, and a time to lose;
A time to keep, and a time to throw away.
A time to tear, and a time to sew;
A time to keep silence, and a time to speak.
A time to love, and a time to hate;
A time for war, and a time for peace.*



It reminded me we have but a short time in this life God has given us. And during that time (and only God knows when our time in this world will come to an end) there are seasons for us to enjoy, to get through, to rest and to labor. As Knights of Columbus, we see ourselves in a number of these "times"!!!

Notice the comma in verse 2..."A time to be born, and a time to die" There is a similar comma in the Hail Mary. The last line of that prayer goes "Pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death". Both commas represent the God given time we have here on earth, from our birth to our death and from this instant to our death. Only God knows the length of our comma. It could be a day, a year, or decades. What are we going to do with that comma?

As Brother Knights you are demonstrating your committing to use the time the comma represents in a positive and constructive manner. In part, your comma is being used for the good of others – for the good of our parishioners in numerous activities around the parish, for the poor in our community through our financial support of Saint Vincent de Paul, for the most vulnerable among us by supporting Life Choice Women's Clinic and praying the Rosary at Planned Parenthood. Your comma supports those with intellectual disabilities through our support of Sunshine Soccer League. It supports the Seminarians of our Diocese and thus future generations of Catholics! Your comma supports our young Catholics through our support of the Newman Center at Grand Canyon University along with the boys, soon to be men, in Boy Scout Troop 916. Your comma also supports the Poor Clare's of Perpetual Adoration of Our Lady of Solitude Monastery aka The Desert Nuns!! Hey, I suspect supporting the Nuns get you at least a double, if not a triple credit!!!

Brothers, feel good about how you're using your comma....but don't ever take it for granted.

My pray for all of us is that at the end of our comma we will receive a loving smile and embrace from Our Lady, and hear the words from her Son, "Well done good and faithful servant. Enter into the joy of your Master."

The annual Ladies High Tea (missing since 2019 due to the pandemic) was back on our schedule.

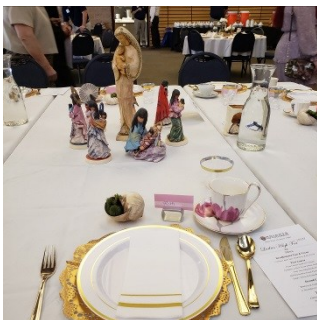
LADIES HIGH TEA HUGE SUCCESS; 115 TICKETS SOLD

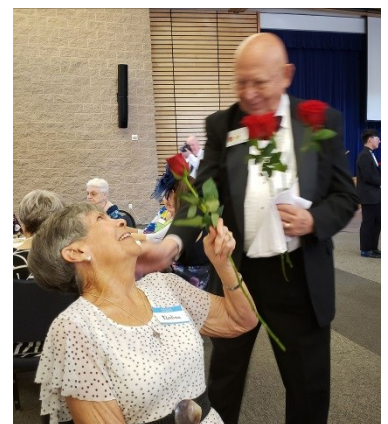
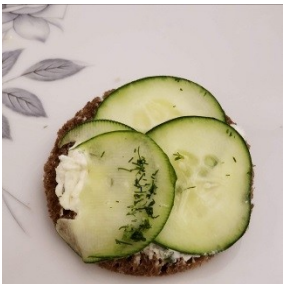

A FLORIDA COURT SETS ATHEIST HOLY DAY

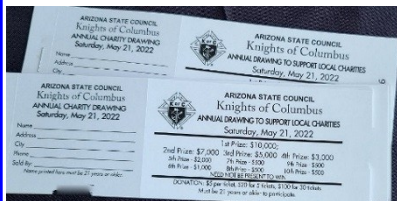

RAFFLE GOALS MADE & EXCEEDED; CHARITIES BENEFIT



Several months ago when our State Raffle Chairman Mike Aguilar announced he had set a goal of \$12,000 in ticket sales for Council 15001, many thought that goal would be unattainable, but anyone who knows Mike Aguilar well knows that when he takes on a goal he will see that everything possible will be done to achieve it! And—OH HOW HE DID!!

On May 19, deadline date for the end of the raffle before the State Convention, Mike turned in his last receipts and the grand total that had been achieved was **\$12,162**. That is almost 11% above our previous high. This means our chosen charities will all receive generous contributions again this year.

Of the \$12,162, 50% or \$6,081, goes to charities selected by the State Knights, while the other \$6,081 goes to charities selected by Council 15001. Our Council voted to distribute our funding as follows:

◆ Women's Life Clinic—\$1,000;



◆ Sunshine Soccer League—\$1,500;



◆ Poor Clare Nuns—\$1,000;



◆ Phoenix Diocese Seminary—\$1,500 (of which \$500 comes from St. Paul's Women's Guild's shredding project);



◆ Newman Center at Grand Canyon University—\$500;



◆ Boy Scout Troop #916—\$500;



◆ and the remaining money to the St. Paul's Chapter of St. Vincent de Paul Society—\$581.



Because we exceeded our goal by more than 10%, we get to direct an additional \$600+, which the officers voted to be distributed as follows: Northern Ariz. Univ. Newman Center \$300+, and Ariz. State Univ. Newman Center \$300+.



In the contest to see which Council member sold the most tickets, Andre Cerna was declared the winner with over \$1,000 in sales, followed closely by last year's winner PGK Dief Diefendorf, with nearly the same amount. Andre will have his name engraved on the Joe Gray Award plaque.

A total of 57 of our members participated in the raffle.

Our funds, along with our list of charities, were taken to the State Convention in Tucson by Chairman Mike Aguilar, Grand Knight Kirk LaPlante and Deputy Grand Knight Francis Abijaoude.

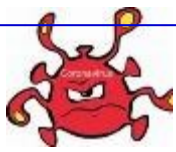
Our Knights In Action
