St. Notburga

St. Zita of Lucca, Italy, is the best-known patron of domestic servants. A less-known contemporary of Zita's was St. Notburga of Austria, who is venerated in the Austrian Tyrol, Bavaria, Istria, Croatia and Slovenia. Many a church in these lands bears her name.

Notburga was born at Rattenberg-on-the-Inn, a town in the Austrian Tyrol not far to the east of Innsbruck. At the age of 18, this devout young woman of peasant stock entered the employment of Count Henry of Rattenberg as a member of his kitchen staff.

Notburga was always very solicitous of the poor. She cut down on her own food, especially on Friday, so as to be able to give something to those who knocked on the kitchen door. Discovering that the staff were used to discarding the abundant food left over from the Count's table, she also began to hand this out, too. Count Henry's mother was apparently unopposed to the charitable practice. But after the mother's death Henry's wife, Countess Otilia, ordered that all leftovers be fed to the pigs. Dismayed, Notburga obeyed for a time, but then renewed her former policy. Unfortunately, the bossy Otilia caught her red-handed one day and saw to it that she was fired.

The young woman then found employment with a farmer at nearby Eben. Her new job involved fieldwork. A charming legend connecting her with harvesting has become a popular tale among the children of Tyrol. Notburga made a practice of going to church for Sunday's first vespers, and her employer had agreed not to interfere. One Saturday, however, when she was engaged in reaping, the vesper bell rang, indicating that Sunday had officially begun. The saint was getting ready to leave for church when the farmer ordered her to continue cutting the grain. She refused. With first vespers it was already Sunday, she said, and Christians do not work on Sunday. "But the weather might change and the crop be lost," he insisted. "All right," said the servant, "Let this sickle decide between us." Thereupon she threw the shiny crescent-shaped tool up into the air, and there it hung like a new moon! The farmer yielded, and she went off to church.

Meanwhile, Count Henry was in a dejected state of mind. Bossy Otilia had died and he had been suffering all sorts of misfortunes, which he was inclined to blame on his dismissal of Notburga. When he remarried, therefore, he asked her to return to his castle as housekeeper. She did so, and lived the rest of her life happily and holily in his employ.

When Notburga was dying, it is said, she urged him to continue taking care of the poor. Furthermore, she instructed him to place her corpse on a wagon drawn by two oxen, and to bury her wherever the oxen might stop in their tracks. Henry complied. The oxen stopped right in front of the chapel of St. Rupert at Eben, so there she was laid to rest.

Although long venerated in the western and Adriatic parts of the Austrian Empire, Notburga was never officially canonized. In March 1862, however, Pope Pius IX formally confirmed her ancient cult and her saintly title.

When St. Notburga is represented in paintings or sculptures, it is often with a sickle, either in her hand or hanging in the sky like a new moon.

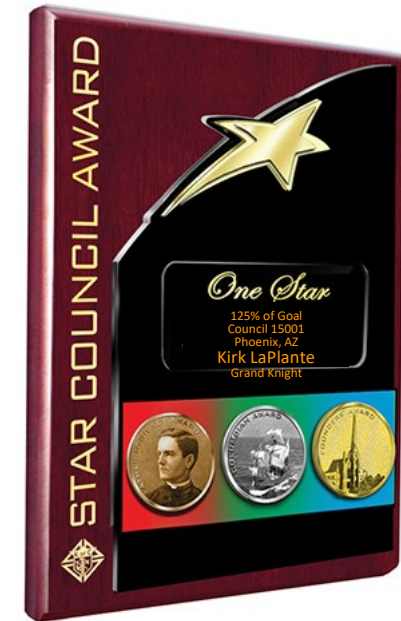

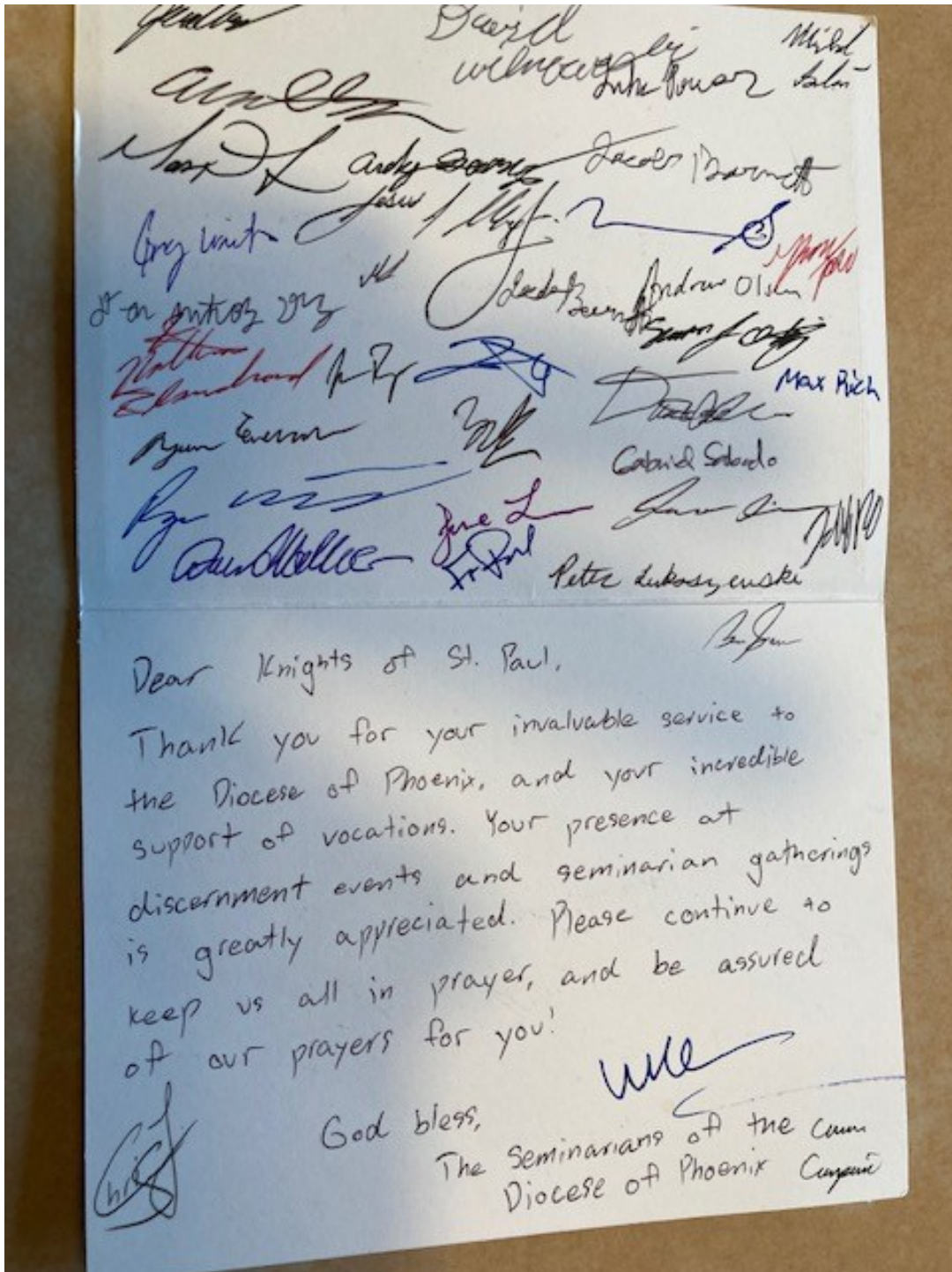
Seminarians Sign Thank You Card

The next scheduled Exemplification of the Fourth Degree will be in Phoenix on Saturday, September 18, 2021. The ceremonial and the banquet will be held at the Sheraton Crescent Hotel, 2620 West Dunlap Avenue, Phoenix, AZ 85021.

Special room rates have been arranged at the Sheraton Crescent. Singles/Doubles are \$94.00 plus tax. *Suites are available from the District Master.*

To reserve a room, call the hotel directly at (602) 943-8200. Be sure to inform them you are with the Knights of Columbus. You can also take advantage of our special on-line Hotel Registration Web Site.

The Class Honoree will be Past State Deputy, Former District Master and Former Vice Supreme Master of the John H. Reddin Province, Michael H. Kingman. Mike also served two tours in Vietnam as a member of an Amphibious Assault Task Force.

The Exemplification will start at 12:00 noon. Following the Exemplification, there will be a reenactment of the Knighting Ceremony for those who want to take photographs.

Fourth Degree Exemplification LETTER OF INSTRUCTION

1. Dress

The dress for the exemplification for Candidates and Sir Knights will be dark suit and tie or tuxedo with pleated white shirt, with a flat collar, black shoes, and bow tie. Members of the Armed Forces, Police, and Firefighters may wear their full dress uniform in lieu of a tuxedo. Priests may wear Clerical Garb with Collar.

Dress for the banquet guests will be formal wear with the ladies wearing evening dress suitable for the occasion.

2. Recruitment

Faithful Navigators are encouraged to visit councils and start recruiting as many Third Degree Knights as possible or that will have their Third Degree by the Exemplification date. At every council meeting, there is time set aside for a Fourth Degree report. Grand Knights should allow the Faithful Navigator or a representative of the Assembly to speak and recruit at this time.

The Faithful Navigator or representative should walk the candidate through the registration process and hand this packet in its entirety to the candidate to complete along with a Form 4.

3. Candidates Membership Application (Form 4)

Example of properly filled out Form 4

All Form 4's must be filled out properly. Be sure the form has the candidate's membership number (top right hand corner) and personal information. Ensure all blocks requiring signatures (Applicant, Sponsor, Council Financial Secretary, Faithful Navigator, and Faithful Comptroller) are completed. Rank or Title is for Priests or Military only. Please type or print legibly in ALL CAPITAL letters.

All required blocks must be completed before sending the Form 4's to the Master. Detach the Assembly's copy of the completed Form 4 and provide it to the Faithful Comptroller. Detach the Council's copy and provide it to the Financial Secretary. Send all other copies (Master's and Supreme's) with the Registration form and payment to the Registration Chairman. See the address at the bottom of page 6. listed in this packet.

NOTE: Incomplete forms will need to be corrected ASAP.

Candidate Fees are \$70.00 which includes one banquet ticket (mandatory and not refundable), a Social Baldric, and a Fourth Degree Lapel Pin. Fees for Priest Candidates including the above are \$50.00. Assemblies take care of (that is, pay for) Priest Fees and accommodations.

PLEASE NOTE: Send properly completed Form 4's with candidate fees paid via checks made payable to Jeffery D. Mansager, shown on the Registration Form. All checks must be sent so as to arrive no later than September 13th, 2021.

4. Ladies Luncheon and Banquet Tickets

Ladies Luncheon Tickets are \$35.00 each. The Third Degree Candidate's fee does not include cost of the Ladies Luncheon.

Banquet Tickets are \$50.00 per person. Candidates with spouses or guest(s) attending must pay the \$50.00 Banquet fee for their spouse and any additional guest(s).

Notify the Registration Chairman by September 13, 2021 of any dietary and/or other special needs by including that information on the Registration Form in the provided block.

5. Mass

Mass will be celebrated in the Hotel Ballroom at 4:00 PM. Everyone is invited. Priests who would like to concelebrate Mass should bring Alb & Stole, and inform the Arizona District Master in advance, per his contact information listed above.

6. Registration Form

Below this packet on the State website, is the required "Registration Form." This registration form must be filled out completely and mailed along with full payment to the registration chairman prior to September 13, 2021. Please mark special needs access (wheelchair/walker) and/or dietary needs in the *Other Special Needs* box.

Make additional copies of all Forms as needed. All documents included with this packet are available on-line at the Arizona Master's web site. Go to: <https://kofc-az.org/patriotic-degree>. These forms can be downloaded, printed, and manually completed and may also be completed on-line using required publishing software. Instructions for electronically completing the Registration Form are posted to the web site.

Assemblies will be seated together where possible for the banquet. *Late registrations will be seated at available spaces and may not be seated with their Assemblies.*

Bio Of Fr. Bitrus

Rev. Fr. Bitrus Teneu Maigamo is from Kaduna State, the North Central of Nigeria, West Africa. Born to the family of Zachariah Maigamo and Elizabeth Nchepteh he has five brothers and no sisters. He was last in position out of the six children of his parents.

He started sensing the call of God while he was in the Minor Seminary when his people back at home had started calling him "Little Father". The desire to become a Catholic priest increased when he was half way through training, but mingling with other friends, prior to his completion, there arose the desire of becoming a chemical engineer, nuclear physicist or computer engineer. This distraction, as he describes it, kept on lingering for a little while up to the time of his final year in the training as a junior seminarian. Nonetheless, having successfully completed the training he finally proceeded to the Senior Seminary after a year of mourning the death of his father.

While in the Major Seminary, he was admitted into the Archdiocese of Kaduna. There he continued with his training of both philosophy and theology. On his completion, he was ordained a transitional deacon under the Archdiocese of Kaduna alongside eleven colleagues. While as a deacon, the diocese of Zaria was carved out of the archdiocese of Kaduna and thereafter he opted for the new diocese. He was thus ordained for the diocese of Zaria alongside his classmate as its first candidates on August 11, 2001 in the Christ the King Cathedral, Zaria Diocese of Kaduna State, Nigeria in West Africa.

Since his ordination, he was given the first canonical assignment as the Vice Rector of his alma mater (St. Joseph Minor Seminary Zaria) and a Parochial Vicar of St. Endas Catholic Parish located within the Seminary. After five years of working experiences, he was made a Pastor of a new erected Parish of St. Anne Catholic Church Zangon Tama II at the same time the Director of Communications of the Diocese. From there, he was sent to Rome after five years to study Missiology in the Gregorian University, in order to prepare for the task of a formator in the Kaduna Provincial seminary known as Good Shepherd Major Seminary located within the metropolis of Kaduna. Having completed his licentiate in missiology, he then proceeded for his doctoral studies.

He is presently doing his PhD dissertation on Islamic Extremism, a Challenge to the Catholic Missionary Activity in Northern Nigeria since 1999: A Missiological Study.

Thereafter, upon completion he hopes to return back to Nigeria and teach in the above-mentioned Major Seminary.

While in America, he has enjoyed the general spirit of the freedom to prove one's worth as it is a land of opportunities.

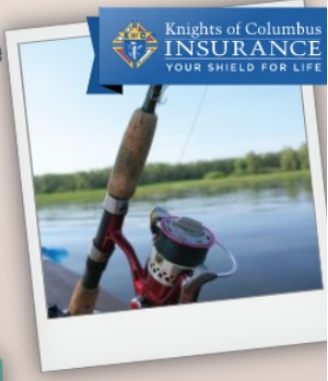

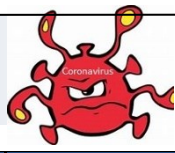

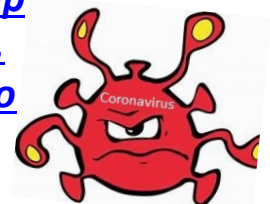
